

City Musical Group Sets Audition Date

To discover and display the best of Lincoln's musical talent, the Lincoln Symphony association will hold a competitive audition for vocalists and instrumentalists March 1.

Winner of the competition will be afforded the opportunity to present a solo appearance with orchestral accompaniment at a public concert to be held at the Stuart theater April 23.

The audition is open to Lincoln residents between the ages of 17 and 26 inclusive, who are studying music with a teacher residing in Lincoln. Members of the symphony board will constitute the audition committee.

Applications.

Applications must be made in writing, must include the signature of the teacher indicating approval to enter the audition, and must be mailed to Ted Butterfield, manager, Lincoln Symphony association, by Feb. 20.

Other requirements are that the participant choose a selection available in the standard orchestral libraries, and that he play the same piece for the solo appearance as for the audition. He must also furnish his own accompanist, and will be required to pay the rental of the orchestral score which he uses.
