Playoff Postponed




Nebraska football followers may think they are seeing things when they take a look at the Scarlet gridders during spring practice periods.

Joe Partington, sterling center on last fall's team, and a threat for all-Big Six honors until a broken hand halted him late in the season, has moved into the ranks of the quarterbacks.

The Joe has not been active in backfield duties during any part of his collegiate career, he did uncork some fleet-footed tactics while playing for North Carolina Pre-Flight against Navy in 1945. During the contest Joe gobbled up a Navy fumble and zoomed to the touchdown which defeated the Middles.

To make up for Partington's shift, husky Tom Novak, a bruising fullback if there ever was one, has stepped up to the center ranks. Novak's vicious line backing ability will not be lost by the transfer, but it will be up to the Scarlet coaching staff to uncover another fullback powered by the same caliber of explosives as Novak seemed to posses
