

Westover Tells KK Show Limit On Ticket Sale

Only 1,650 tickets will be sold to the spring Kosmet Klub show, "Aksarben Nights," according to Van Westover, Kosmet Klub business manager. The show will be presented three nights, April 17, 18 and 19.

Reservation coupons are now being sold by Kosmet Klub workers at a price of 75c each, and for seat reservations without further cost at the Temple theater these coupons may be exchanged box office on April 14, 15, 16, 17.

Co-authors of "Aksarben Nights" are Dave Andrews and Bill Wiseman. Max Whittaker, speech department instructor, is directing the show.

The show has an all-male cast which includes a 20-man pony chorus. "Aksarben Nights" is the first Kosmet Klub spring production since 1942. "Pott Shots" was the name of the show which was written by Bob Aldrich. It dealt with a college, rapidly going broke, that schemed to obtain the money of a corset manufacturer, an alumnus of a rival school.
