

# Bergoffen Heads Circulation Of "Progressive" Magazine

Charles Bergoffen, arts and science freshman, has been named circulation manager of the Progressive, new intercollegiate magazine.

Bergoffen will be in charge of the distribution of the new publication on the university campus and this section of the country until a complete circulation on each individual campus.

Russ Compton, national circulation manager, stated that the selection of Bergoffen was made by a group of the national editors.

In explaining the new publication, Bergoffen explained that this magazine is to be published monthly during the school year by the Harvard Liberal Union, and is intended to be representative of student opinion in the United States.

Mr. Fuerbringer has been the head of Concordia Teachers College since 1941. He graduated from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Mo., and has received the B. D. and S. T. M. degrees. He held pastorates in Oklahoma and Kansas before his election to the office of president of the Seward college.

Chancellor John L. Knight, the new head of Nebraska Wesleyan university, will lead Wednesday's services. He came to Wesleyan from Willamette University, Salem, Ore., where he was assistant professor of religion and counselor of religion. Chancellor Knight has written religious magazine articles. He graduated cum laude from Drew University in 1939, receiving his A. M. and S. T. B. degrees cum laude from Boston University in 1941 and 1942, respectively. He received an A. M. degree from Vanderbilt University in 1943.
