

# VETS NEWS

A discussion of the domestic affairs platform to be used at the national convention of AVC at Milwaukee, June 19 to 23, will be conducted by the university chapter of the American Veterans Committee tonight at 7:15 in room 316 of the Union.

The platform was drawn up by the national domestic affairs committee of AVC which is headed by Robert Nathan, noted national economist.

Highlights of the platform include support for measures by government, business and labor to insure full employment, fair employment practices, increased minimum wage laws, federal unemployment compensation, strong labor unions with guaranteed collective bargaining rights and a closed shop.

### Federal Aid to Education.

The platform advocates increased salaries for teachers, and federal aid to states on basis of "need."

It backs increased old age and unemployment insurance based on a pay-as-you-go basis.

In the realm of taxation it asks for an equitable tax policy that gives relief first to tax payers in the lower brackets.

### Services Unification.

The pre-convention platform asks for a unified armed force, voluntary enlistment without compulsory military training, and investigation of the court-martial system.

Representatives from each of the Barb clubs, from independent houses, and from the dormitories make up the USA council. Each unaffiliated student is automatically a member of the association.

Tassel filings close today, according to President Harriet Quinn. Qualified women students may file in the Ag and city campus Union offices.

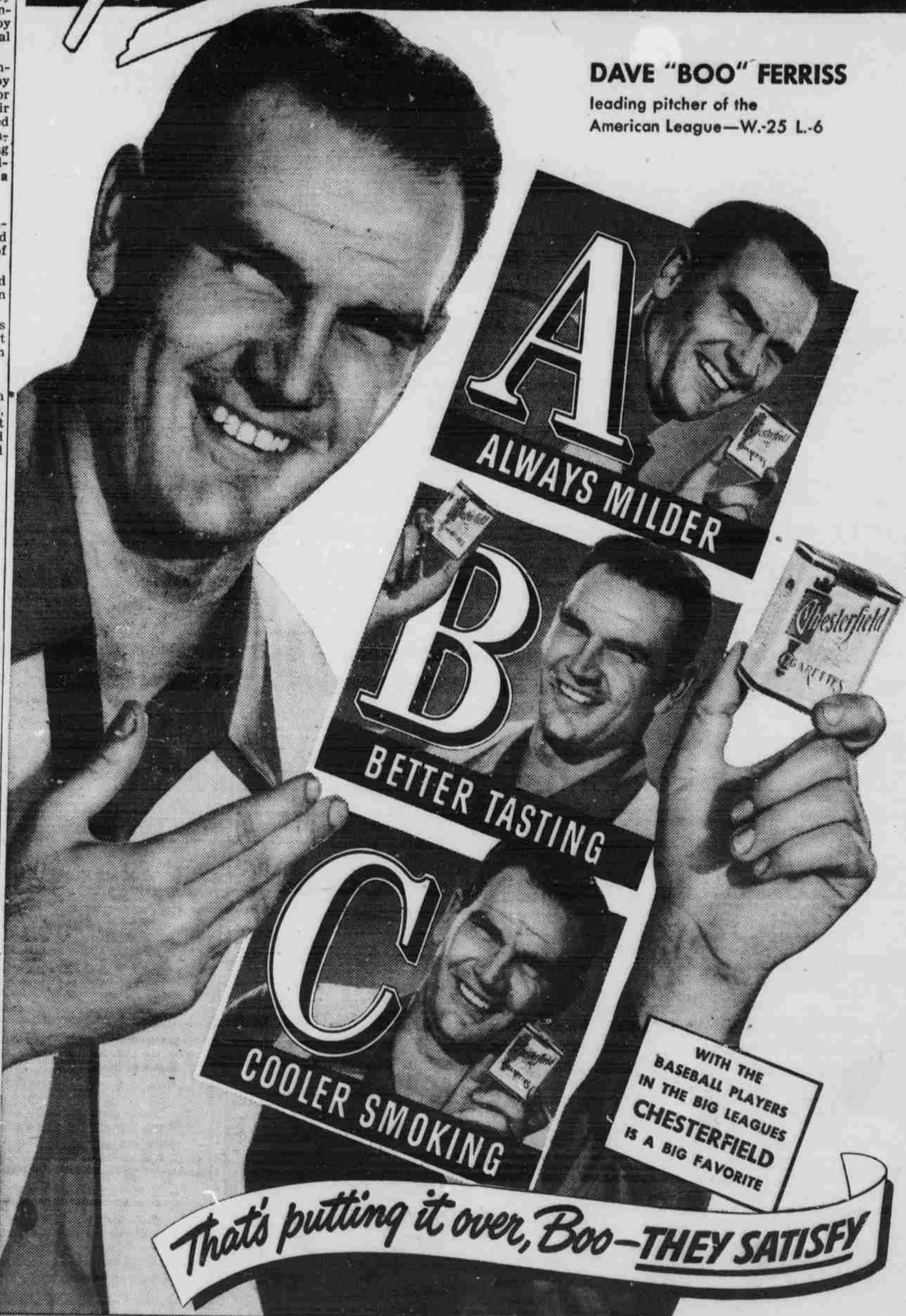
### MEN'S SING.
