Lt. Lawrence J. Bolan, Lincoln army recruiting office, and John Henly, arts and science student, presented diametrically opposed viewpoints about the proposed universal military training program during the Tuesday evening meeting of the American Veterans Committee at the Lincoln YWCA.

Lieutenant Bolan told AVC members that UMT's would reserve their civilian rights and would not be subject to courts martial. Bolan also stated that UMT's would not be sent overseas.

"Now that the Arctic has been conquered and distances are being shrunk almost daily, the universal military training program would be a definite advantage to our national defense," Lieutenant Bolan concluded.

Hanly Disagrees.

"The best preparation for war during peacetime would be for the government to underwrite a universal college education program for the youth of America," Hanly asserted.

Hanly went on to say that, "Although the code of conduct for UMT's would be drawn up by members of religion, science, education, industry, and labor, the 'khaki' element would loom overwhelmingly behind the civilian board."

AVC Against UMT.

After the talks a discussion period followed and individual AVC members reviewed all the points of universal military training. At the conclusion of the discussion AVC voted unanimously to present their national AVC convention delegate, Paul Rogers, with a mandate to vote against the UMT program.
