

Betas Gain Narrow 7-6 IM Victory

Roland Emmett's pass to Bob Means for an extra point proved the margin of victory as Beta Theta Pi squeezed by Kappa Sigma 7-6 in an IM football tilt Thursday afternoon.

Delta Upsilon picked up a narrow 1-0 win over Sigma Phi Epsilon and Sigma Chi downed a fighting Alpha Gamma Rho team 2-0 in other contests. The Wranglers were 2-0 forfeit victors as the ROTC club failed to put in an appearance.

Although controlling the ball for most of the contest, the Betas were forced to come from behind in the late minutes after the Kappa Sigs struck in the early moments with a Deichlur to Sullivan aerial for their lone marker.

Levine Scores

Late in the game, Bill Levine snagged Emmett's toss for a TD to knot the count. Means then scored the extra point to clinch the game.

Delta Upsilon was awarded a 1-0 win over Sigma Phi Epsilon by piling up a yardage advantage after the regular game ended in a scoreless tie. In a series of four downs, the DU's advanced the pigskin up field 15 yards while the Sig Eps failed to gain any yardage on a running play after three passes failed.

Sigma Chi chalked up its second win with a narrow 2-0 win over Alpha Gamma Rho at the Ag field. Tom Morrow trapped an AGR back in the end zone after the latter intercepted a Sig Chi forward pass. Both teams displayed a rugged defensive game.

Hefty Line

Line Tutor Tony Blazine will get a chance to see the efforts of three weeks of intensive practice with his block busters against one of the toughest backfields in the Big Nine. Blazine's crew, sporting a neat 215-pound average, boasts a 19-pound per man advantage over the Hoosiers' forwards who tip the Fairbanks at an average of 194.

Big Charlie Toogood, carrying 232 pounds on his gargantuan frame tops the Husker beefers. End Carl Samuelson, All-Big Six tackle last year and Center Tom Novak, all-conference fullback selection in 1946 will bolster a forward wall with Game Captain Gene Wilkins, only regular who started the '46 Hoosier battle in this year's starting contingent, Big Johnny Sedlacek, converted from tackle to guard and Jack Pesek.

Backfield Edge

Indiana's backs, averaging 197, make up for some weight deficiency. They carry 25 pounds per man more than the Husker's starting backfield combination.

The Hoosiers are slated to arrive in Lincoln Friday morning and will go through a light workout behind closed gates at Memorial Stadium Friday afternoon.

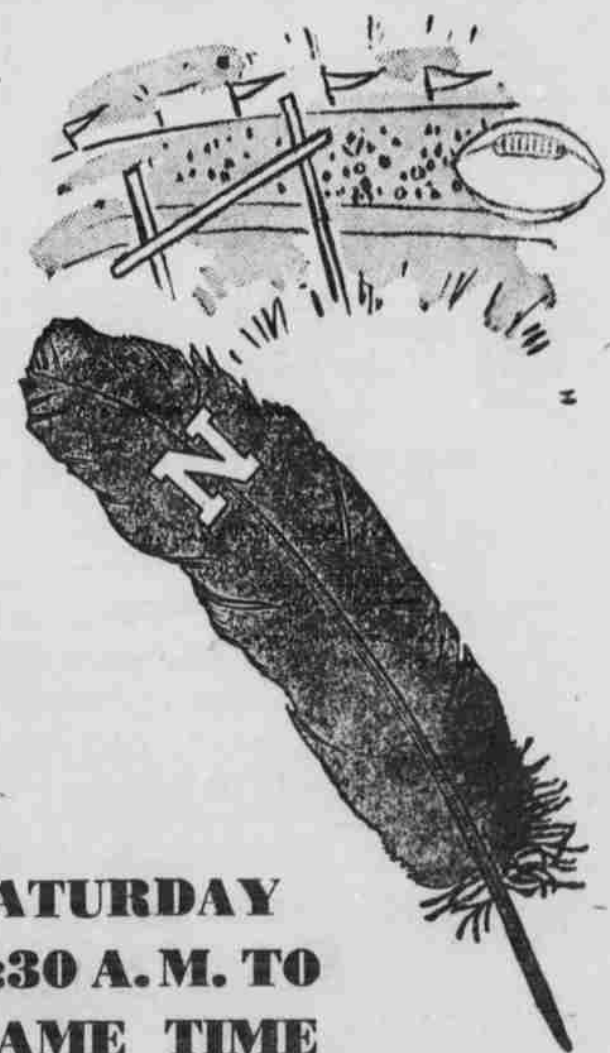
