

Name Lorenz Captain Huskers Entertain Gophers

Fred Lorenz, 188 pounds of TNT will captain the Huskers Saturday afternoon when Bernie Masterson's Scarlet clads collide with Minnesota's Golden Gophers.

Lorenz' steady guard performance against the touted Hoosiers, one bright spot in the Huskers' loss, earned him the captaincy for the traditional battle with the Norsemen.



With game number one in the past, Coach Warren Beson Masterson pepped his Husker charges through a lengthy practice session Monday afternoon to polish his "T" machine for the Gopher clash.

Passing Drill

Masterson and backfield Coach Dougal Russell conducted a passing drill while Line Mentor Tony Blazine pushed his forwards through a rugged contact session with Ray DeBolt's Nubbins crew. Del Wiegand, who handled his first varsity assignment against the Hoosiers, was tossing the aerials with Joe Partington and Dick Thompson. Although still favoring a bad knee, Thompson was in uniform after a week on the sidelines.

Bernie Bierman, wily Minnesota tutor, will bring his Gophers to Memorial Stadium fresh from a narrow 7-6 win over Washington. Minnesota's forward wall is characteristic of the Gopher bone-crushers of old, but the Silver Fox is moaning over the lack of size in his backfield.

Veteran Linemen

Warren Beson, 200 pounder, is an important cog in the beefy forward wall. The two-year veteran shuffled from his center position late last fall, will be out to play havoc with Husker ball carries once again.

Bierman will be depending on the heft of Bill Thiele, 190-pound quarterback, and the speed and deception of Halfback Ev Faunce

Big Six Clubs Gain Pair Wins Over Weekend

Big Six football clubs ran into stiff opposition in intersectional tilts over the week-end with only Oklahoma and Kansas U. gaining victories. The Sooners downed a stubborn Detroit U. eleven 24-20, and Kansas, using their star back Ray Evans very little, margined Denver U. 9-0.

Missouri's Tigers were unable to stop a determined Ohio State club as the Buckeyes gained a 13-7 victory in the closing minutes. The Missourians, after sending Sub Fullback Ed Quirk over from the five yard stripe, maintained a 7-6 margin until two minutes and 40 seconds before the final gun.

A second quarter 48-yard pass gave the favored Colorado Buffaloes a 7-0 nod over Iowa State. The lighter Cyclone eleven moved to Colorado's one-foot line before being stopped on downs with 45 seconds remaining. Ron Norman, Iowa State back, brought the 8,500 fans to their feet with his last minute passing attack.

The Kansas State Wildcats, coached by former Nebraska All-American Sam Francis, were the other conference representatives to go down in defeat. Texas Mines decided the Manhattan boys 20-0.

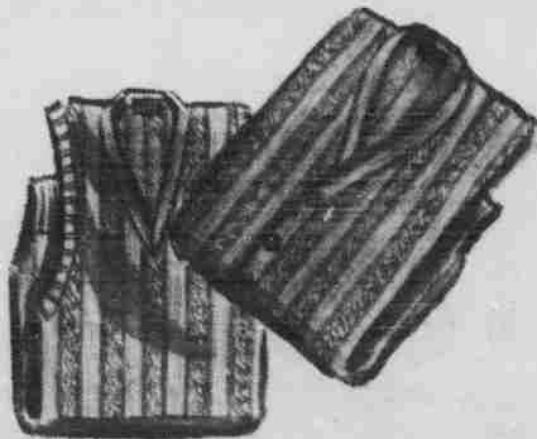
