Cartoons by Fitzpatrick Are Displayed 2 Weeks at Morrill

Twenty-five full-size originals of Pulitzer Prize winning cartoons by Daniel R. Fitzpatrick are the main feature of the current Art Exhibition in Morrill Hall.

The Exhibition, which opened in Gallery A Sunday, October 5, has been creating an unusual amount of interest among students and other gallery visitors.

Fitzpatrick, who is editorial cartoonist of the St. Louis Post-Dispatch will be here Thursday, Oct. 9, to speak at the annual fall journalism awards dinner. His drawings are arranged in sequence from 1945 to Sept. 9, 1947 and are

accompanied by ten reproduced newspaper cartoons, showing how they actually appeared in print.

Simple and forceful in style and drawn with skill, this series gives telling commentaries on some of the principle events of the past two years, from war crises to the period of inflation and high prices.

Another wall of Gallery A is devoted to a series of photographs of the St. Louis Press Photographer's Association.


