Faculty Rejects Snyder to Speak Student Council At Economics Meet Amendment

Revisions in the student council constitution increasing the size of its judiciary committee were rejected by the faculty senate committee on student activities, meet-ing Wednesday afternoon in El-len Smith hall. The announcement was made by Dean of Men T. J. Thompson, chairman of the senate committee.

The amendment would have increased the number of students on the judiciary committee from five to seven. It would also have required that three juniors and one senior at large be elected to the committee. The constitution as it now stands requires that a chairman elected from senior members of the council, and four council holdover members comprise the committee.

Dean Thompson also announced that the faculty committee approved the constitution of Nebraska chapter of the United World Federalists as a matter of

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
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
