Mr. Smith, director of the Lincoln men's chorus, is also a soloist at the Christian Science church. Mrs. Anderson is a graduate of the University of California, and former soloist in musical presentations in Berkeley and San Francisco, and at Trinity Methodist church in Berkeley. Both Mr. Smith and Mrs. Anderson were soloists in last year's presentation of the "Messiah."

Opera Lead

Miss Thompson appeared in the leading role of Santuzza in the opera "Cavalleria Rusticana," a university presentation in 1946. She studied one year with Russell Anderson of Wayne, Neb., and has been studying with Dr. Westbrook for the past three years. Miss Thompson was soloist for the "Messiah" in 1945.

Aside from attending Illinois Wesleyan for two years, Mr. Ellis has gained much musical experience by singing for two years with the Heidelberg Octette, Chicago, and with Horace Heidt's orchestra for one year. He has done both solo and chorus work for one season each with the St. Louis Opero Company and the Chicago Opera Company. In addition, Mr. Ellis has not only made recordings, but also some movies with Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer and Universal Pictures. He plans to return to school to obtain a Bachelor's degree in music.
