

# NU Nips Tigers, 46-44

## Schleiger Sinks Winning Basket in Final Seconds

**KANSAS CITY.**—A field goal by Center Dick Schleiger with only 40 seconds of playing time remaining boosted Nebraska to a 46-44 first round Big Six tourney victory over the Missouri Tigers Thursday afternoon.

Nebraska, trailing 27-18 at the half, staged a terrific uphill rally. Guard Joe Brown sparked the Scarlet five with 12 points. The smooth ball-handler put the Huskers into winners will meet in the Finals Saturday.

Forward Claude Retherford contributed heavily to Nebraska's rally with ten points, Retherford's fielder with seven minutes left knotted the count.

After Coach Harry Good's five jumped into the lead the score was knotted three times before Schleiger tallied. It was the lanky pivot's only field goal of the afternoon.

In other games played at Kansas City, Kansas State surprised well-regarded Oklahoma 55-48 and the Oklahoma Aggies trounced Iowa State 44-33.

# Three Sports Increase IM Sports Action

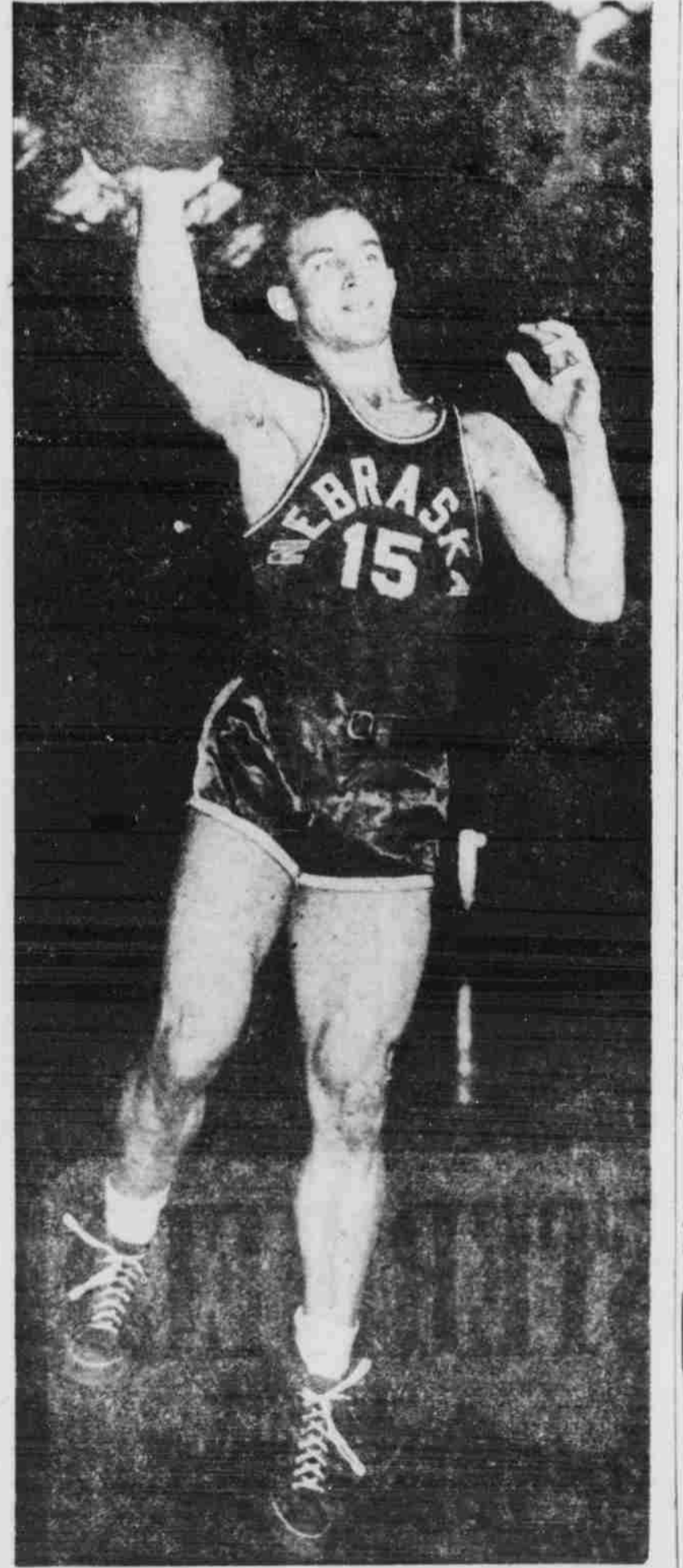
The Intramural race will break wide open after the first of the year as competition in three sports will be initiated before the end of January.
