

Men's Point Board Requests Report Individual Point Totals

Point listings of all men office holders were requested by the Men's point board today in a letter to all student organizations and residences.

The listings must be turned in before Monday, Feb. 2, according to the letter. Replies should be mailed to "Men's point Board, Student Union Building."

Official activity point totals for each man will be compiled on the basis of the reports turned in, Stan Johnson, point board chairman, announced. Groups not getting instruction sheets by campus mail should send the board the points of each officer and member, he said.

Ultimatum.

"No individual may carry more than the official maximum number of points after Feb. 2," Johnson emphasized. "Extra offices must be given up before then. Anyone overpointed after that must give up the office determined by the board."

New point rating were assigned activities Dec. 18 to take effect pointed offices have four points. The old rating system went up to five. Individual totals permitted

were lowered correspondingly. Besides meeting general university eligibility requirements activity men are restricted to the following point totals:

Rule for Men.

(1) freshmen and first semester transfer students, no more than two points; (2) sophomores, no more than four points, nor three if their average is under 4.5; (3) juniors, no more than seven points, nor four if their average is under 4.5; and (4) seniors, no more than seven points, nor five if their average is under 4.5.

The board was set up by the student council in 1937 to regulate participation of male students in activities to permit more to participate and prevent over-burdening of a few individuals.

Wool Judges Gather Honors At Denver Show

The University of Nebraska finished ahead of Utah and Wyoming to take top honors in the wool judging contest held Sunday at Denver, Colo.

The winning Nebraska team was composed of Robert Meade, Tecumseh; Norbert Tiemann, Campbell; and Eugene Jensen, St. Edward. By virtue of their conquest, the team received the Challenge trophy, presented by United States Testing company of Hoboken, New Jersey.

In previous judging at the show, the Nebraska delegation ranked third in the carlot judging held Friday afternoon. Texas Tech and Montana ranked ahead of the Nebraskans in that order.

Saturday's competition found the team placing sixth in all classes of livestock, with a second rating in cattle and a third in hogs. Gene Gard of Beaver Crossing grabbed individual recognition as high man in cattle and fifth in all classes of livestock.

The livestock team was composed of Vaughn Johnson, Omaha, in addition to Gard, Meade, Tiemann and Jensen. Prof. E. V. Dunlap was team coach.
