Union Hobby Schedule Open House Feb. 4

Students interested in handicraft work are going to be provided with an outlet for their hobby talents.

The Hobby Interest committee of the Union will hold an open house Wed., Feb. 4, from 1 to 5 p. m. to display finished crafts made by university students and to explain handicraft opportunities and plans.

A handicraft shop will be held every Tuesday and Wednesday from 1-5, and on Wednesday from 7-9:30 p. m., beginning the week of Feb. 11, if students show interest at the open house. The display will include work of students in the Fine Arts department and articles made last summer in a Union hobby shop. Coffee and brownies will be served.

Both the open house and shop will meet in Room 12 of the Union. A storeroom, at present, will be converted into handicraft room with new equipment, according to Duane Lake, Union director.

The shop will be conducted by Tibby Curley and Marge Cherney of the committee, and instructors will be Roland Mills, Don Ellis and Albert Ostergaard.

For example: If a student is scheduled for an examination which conflicts with a specially scheduled examination in French, arrangements should be made with the French department to take such French examination at another time.

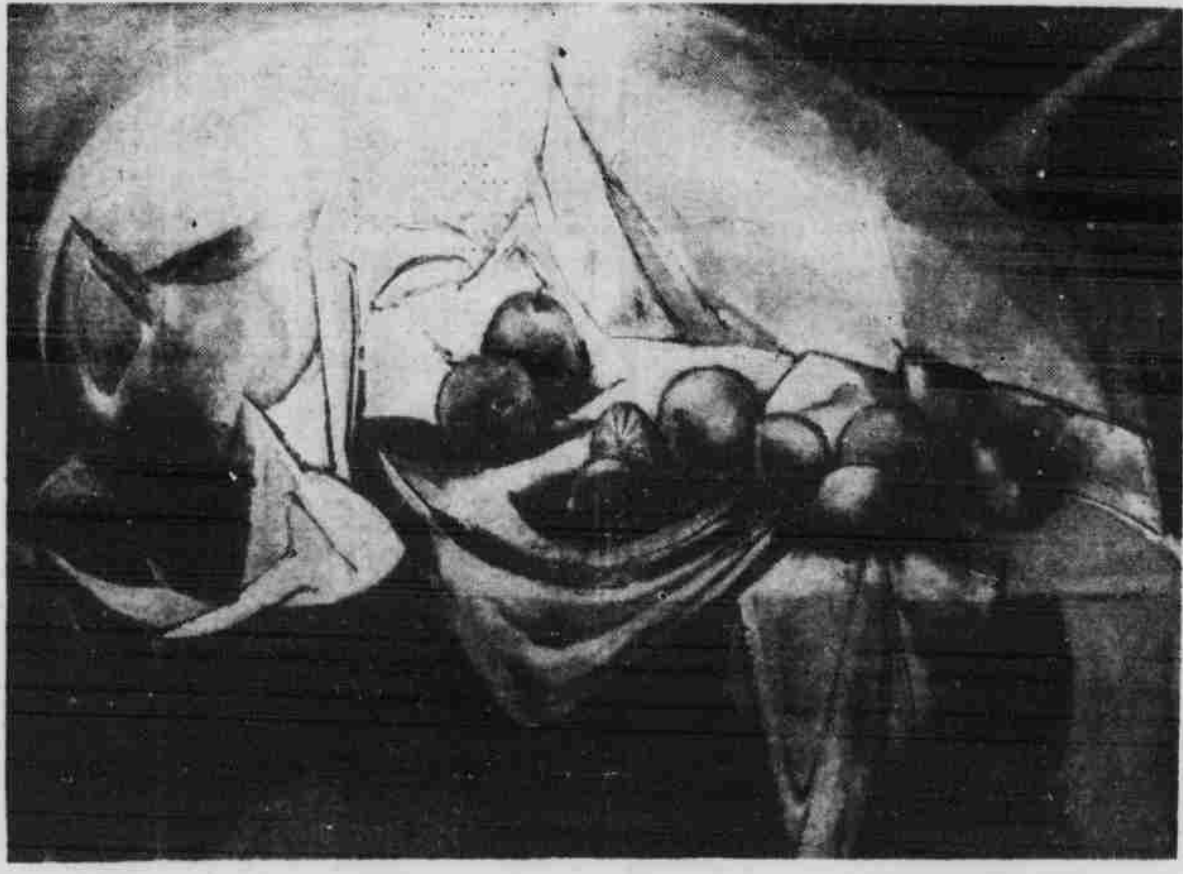
