

# Warren Backs UMT In Monday's Speech

California's Gov. Earl Warren called government the "most important business" in everyone's life in a speech Monday afternoon before the Young Republicans group at the Cornhusker hotel.

He went on to say that the country "needs spirit to do the things that must be done," and stated that younger people should be entrusted with more governmental jobs, as they are in his own state.

### Answers Questions.

But the real gist of the Republican presidential aspirant's appearance came in answer to questions from the floor following the speech.

In answer to the question, "How do you stand on Universal Military Training?" Warren said he supports it and that it is "essential to the welfare of the people." The Californian advocated training for a few months,

preferably adjusted to the system of higher education.

### Sees Tragic Results.

The speaker foresaw tragic results if the Marshall Plan fails to work. He stated that "no person can underwrite the success of the ERP." He feels we are compelled to try to rehabilitate the world.

Quizzed on governmental rent regulation, Warren said he was opposed to peace-time controls, except where essential to make economy work or to lick inflation.

He said that the basic mistake of OPA was that it tried to control everything from Washington. "If rent controls had been determined locally instead of nationally," he said, "there would have been a better result."

# World Travel Tours Set Up By Columbia U.

Sightseeing plus insight is the keynote of the some twenty study tours planned this summer\* by World Study tours of the Columbia university travel service.

World Studytours, a non-profit educational corporation, conducted their first post-war tour the summer of 1946. It held six tours last summer. Studytours for 1948 vary in length from 21 to 97 days. They cost from \$230 to \$1960. Tours are planned in Eastern Europe, behind the iron curtain, as well as Western Europe, South America, Hawaii, Australia, New Zealand, and points in the United States.

Round trip rates for the European tours from New York are about \$600. This includes transportation, rooms, meals, and admissions.

Group leaders skilled in combining recreation with travel, are

provided to help and observe people live abroad.

Studytours are a continuance of the pre-war "Open Road." They are sponsored to promote international friendship.
