

Husker Nine Faces Tigers, IS This Week

Nebraska university's crippled baseball team left on a four-game trip to Missouri and Iowa Thursday.

The 16-man Husker squad opposes the University of Missouri at Columbia, April 23 and 24 and Iowa State college at Ames, April 26 and 27.

Coach Tony Sharpe has four men on the injury list, although three of them will make the junket.

Fred Hegwood of Omaha is out for the season with a broken leg. He was hitting .414 for six games.

Tom Novak of Omaha, with a dislocated finger, Angelo Ossino of Omaha, with a charley horse, and Wesley Maser of Lincoln, with a sprained ankle, are the other varsity injuries.

Sandstedt to Start.
Omaha's Jim Sandstedt has drawn the opening mound job against the Tigers. Elroy (Lefty) Gloystein of Waco will start the second game. Both pitchers have won two and lost one this year.

Coach Sharpe is still looking for a replacement to fill Hegwood's field position. He has been experimenting with Harland Powley of Pender and Don Hays of Lincoln, a utility infielder.

Don Morrison and Stan Martin will run in the open 2-mile. They will join with Harold Kopft and Russell Hale to form the 4-mile team.

Dick Hutton, Harry Meginnis, Don Vollertsen and Alan Thompson will run the 440 and 880-yard relays. Hutton and Thompson also will run in the 100 yard dash.

Dick Piderit will compete in the shot put. In three practice throws Wednesday, Piderit bettered 50 feet. His best toss was 51 feet 2 inches.

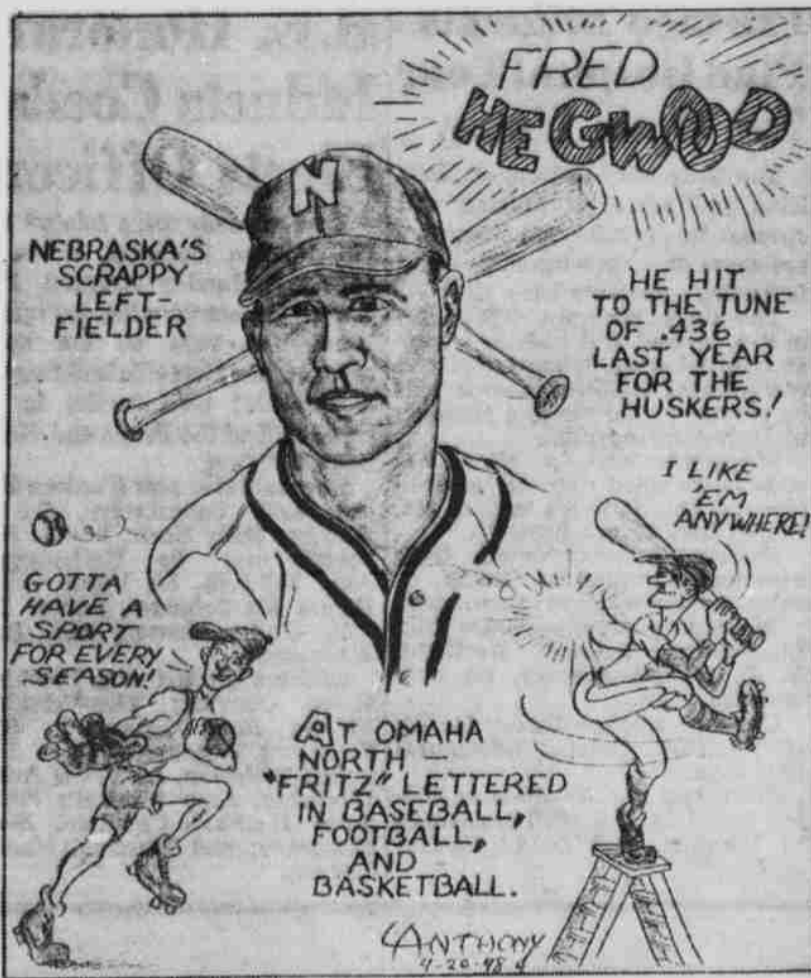
Jim Myers will compete in the pole vault. Don Cooper, who aggravated his sprained ankle early in the week, was shelved again by the injury.

Delta Theta Phi, professional law fraternity, will have a party Saturday night at 8:30 p. m., in Boomer's hall.

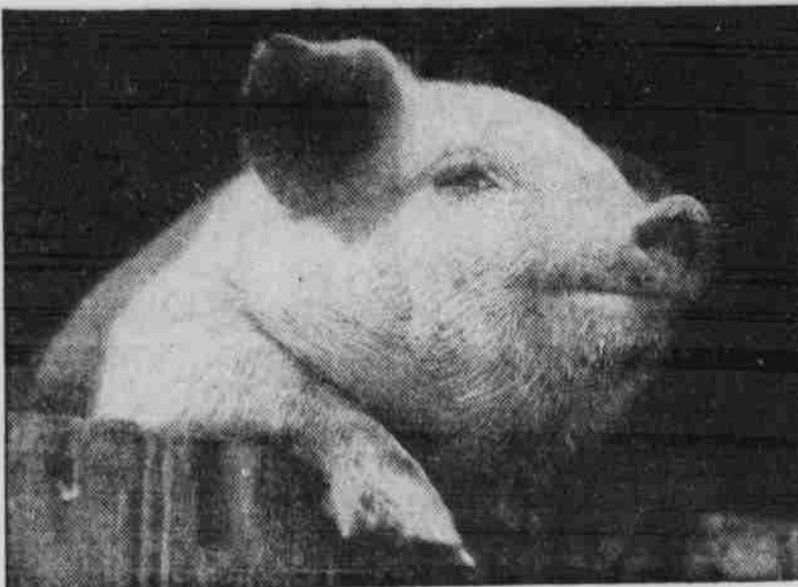
Baseball Seating Capacity Larger
