### **Educators End** Counseling Confab Friday

A three day counseling and guidance conference attended by school representatives from 15 states ended here Friday.

The conference, in a final shot at inadequate teacher training courses, adopted a report from its basic course committee which said teacher training schools should make available counseling and guidance fundamentals for all students who expect to teach.

The committee was hitting at the principle that it is the teacher's responsibility to provide not only academic training, but also the help the students need with their individual problems. J. E. Woods of the University of Omaha, head of the committee, had this to say about teacher had this to say about teacher training institutions:

"There is an apparent reluc-tance on the part of teacher trainers to introduce new courses or reorganize existing ones to adequately implement a training program for personnel workers."
