

Neal Mehring Named New Assistant Coach at NU

New assistant coach at the University is Neal Mehring, it was announced by Acting Athletic Director George "Potsy" Clark.

Mehring resigned as head coach at Adams State college of Alamosa, Colo., to accept the Nebraska post. Graduated from Nebraska in 1936, he played football for the Cornhuskers in 1932, '33, '35.

Coached at Lincoln.

He coached at Lincoln high in 1936, at Salida, Colo., high school from 1937 to 1944 and moved to LaJunta, Colo., high school in 1945.

Mehring reinstated a program of inter-collegiate athletics at Adams State College.

Won Championship.

His football team won the New Mexico conference football championship in 1946 and was runnerup to Highland university in the basketball race. In 1947, Adams State finished second in football.

"We are mighty happy that Neal Mehring decided to return to his alma mater," Clark said. "His record as a coach indicates he is definitely one of the younger men destined for greater things."
