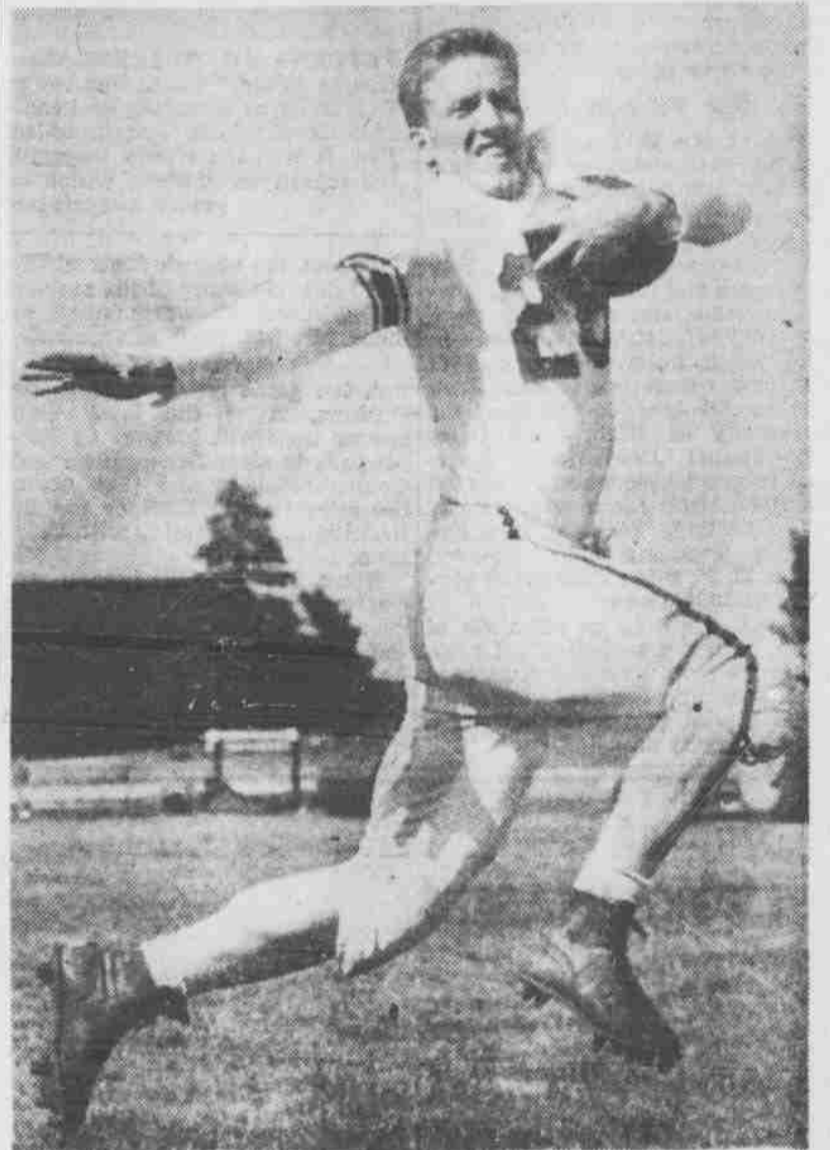

Junior is one of two men on this year's squad who have lettered three years in football. He lettered in 1944 and after a naval hitch returned to letter in 1946 and again last year. He was an All-State selection while playing for Scottsbluff high. (Upper right) Tom Novak, University of Nebraska center, is being boomed for All-American honors. An All-Big Six selection the past two falls, Novak was put on Bill Stern's pre-season squad behind Chuck Bednarik of Penn and Alex Sarkesian of Northwestern. Last year Notre Dame tabbed him as their outstanding opposing lineman.

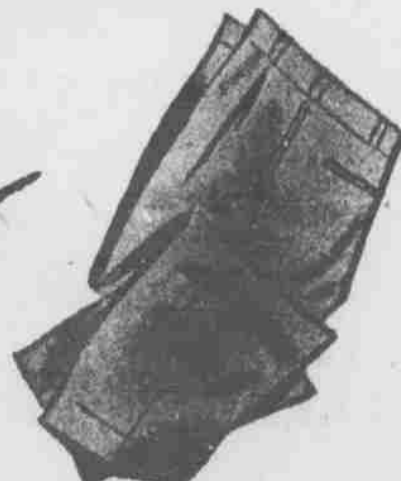
