New Students Receive Check In Speech Lab

Now is the time for all good men—is the familiar saying which echoed through the speech laboratory halls last week during the rush of registration. This little sentence and many others like it aid the speech laboratories in finding defective speech among new students.

The speech and hearing laboratories on second floor of the Temple building fulfill two purposes: to test students for speech and hearing, and to help those students having defects in speaking and hearing to correct them.

In testing the students various machines are used which find defective hearing. Faulty diction can be discovered by different paragraphs which the student reads or by conversation with a trained instructor. Careful records are kept of each new student's interview.

If a student should be corrected in either speech or hearing, the laboratories urge him to take advantage of the facilities. It is entirely free to a university student. The laboratory helps to fit hearing aids or teaches lip reading. Defects in speech can be corrected by attending the numerous classes offered by the speech department.
