

# DU, ZBT, Beta Sig Win Phi Delts Beat Pioneer;

Beta Sigma Psi took an intercepted pass 35 yards in the last five minutes of play to down a stubborn Delta Tau Delta team 6-0 Tuesday at the Ag College. Delta Upsilon and Zeta Beta Tau won first round matches as they downed Delta Sigma Pi and Sigma Phi Epsilon by forfeit and a 1-0 count, respectively.

Wolfert proved to be the gun in the Beta Sig offense, while Engler, Weimer, and Tremain stood out defensively for the Delts.

It was a pass from Jim Sharp to Van Norman that Wolfert ran in and intercepted the pass, running down the sidelines behind precision blocking to score the lone tally.

### Recover Fumble.

The Delts, led by Sharp and Van Norman, came back with long passes, but failed to connect. In the other Ag game, Potter and Gerlach passed Phi Delta Theta to a 6-0 victory over a tough Pioneer Co-op team.

After recovering a fumble near the Pioneers' goal line Potter passed to Donegan for the Phi Delt score.

The Phi Delt offense boomed with Potter's and Gerlach's passes. Mizner's kicking was also an important factor.

Zeta Beta Tau gained their 1-0 victory over Sigma Phi Epsilon by out-yarding the Sig Ep's five yards in overtime play.

According to intramural regulations if a game ends in a tie the teams are given four downs with the winner of the game being the team making the most yardage.

### Penalty Proves Costly.

Neither team threatened seri-

ously during first half play but a tough battle of pass interceptions livened the contest during the second half.

A costly penalty charged against the Sig Ep's for roughing gave the ball to the ZBT's in the play-off period.

All pairings will be announced Friday, Oct. 1, and the players will swing into action on the third at the Mury courts at 27th & J streets, at the City courts at 27th & A streets, and at the Lincoln Tennis Club courts at 35th and South streets.

All men in the University, except tennis letter men, are eligible to enter. Last year's champion, Dick Means, will not compete this year, thus forecasting a wide open race with several outstanding netmen for the finals.

IM Director Means announced that UN students would soon enjoy tennis play on six new Grass-tex courts which are now under construction between the Coliseum and the new P. E. Building. These courts will have lights and will afford continuous play daily until 9:30 p. m.

The courts are the result of three years' effort to secure a place for general student recreation and an opportunity to teach tennis to students who have never had the privilege.
