Coach Patsy Clark's Nebraska gridmen will face their third conference foe this Saturday at Lawrence, Kansas, when they meet the Kansas Jayhawkers.

The Huskers long have been a jinx to the KU football team and anything could happen. The Jayhawkers scored a 12-0 win over a stubborn George Washington eleven Friday night while the Huskers bowed to a powerful Notre Dame club, 44-13.

Missouri Opens Loop Play.

In the other conference game this week, Coach Don Faurot's vaunted Missouri Tigers finally make their loop debut against Iowa State at Columbia. The Missourians possess wins over SMU, Navy and St. Louis and have lost to Ohio State this year. The Cyclones rapped Colorado last week, 18-7, but do not figure to outlast the Mizzou eleven.

Both Colorado and Oklahoma will tests non-conference foes this weekend. The Sooners will meet Texas Christian, a 14-13 winner over Kansas U, at the TCU home field. Last week the Oklahoma gridders romped to a 42-0 verdict over Kansas State.

Colorado plays host to a home-state eleven when they go against Colorado State.

Kansas State is idle this week. Big Seven prestige was boosted during the past two weeks by Missouri wins over SMU and Navy and the Oklahoma Sooner's triumph over Texas U.

Fischer Among Leaders.

In the scoring department, George Thomas of Oklahoma held his lead in the individual scoring race, with a total of 36 points. Nebraska's Cletus Fischer is tied for fifth place with 18 points.
