Experimental Play, 'No Exit,' Tops One Act Productions

Portraying the philosophy of existentialism, "No Exit," a drama written by Jean Paul Sartre, was performed with superb acting Thursday evening on the Experimental Theatre stage.

Gaylord Marr, as Garcin, descended to melodrama on the occasion, and was convincingly intense throughout most of the show, adeptly portraying the suave man of affairs whose bravado melts in the heat of emotional realism, leaving the naked coward.

Miss Betty Schultz showed flashes of brilliant acting as she caught the power of her role. The most consistently well-acted part in a polished production was Estelle, played by D. Ann Richardson. Miss Richardson displayed great talent in her part of penetrating character analysis. Her last glimpse of life on earth, played against a background of "Saint Louis Blues," was the dramatic highlight of the performance.

MacDonald Performs.

Jack MacDonald, as the devil's

underling, the valet, played his restricted role with finesse, his facial expression alone carrying the part.

Abe Katz, director of the play, showed intelligent understanding of the author, Sartre, combined with a high sense of theatre. The background music was predominantly Shostakovich, and heightened the mood of the play without overshadowing the acting.

"If Men Played Cards, As Women Do," the first of the three experimental plays, was a comedy. The four actors, Sanford Levey, Al Dorschtman, Michael Shanahan, and Don Veta, are to be commended for displaying the necessary verve, not as essential in a drama. Miss Margaret Dutton directed the play.

Miss Dutton also did an excellent job of direction with "The Twelve Pound Look." The performance was well timed and showed good characterization, particularly on the part of Dean Wells, as Sir Harry, and Sharon Fritzier as Lady Sims.
