

Washington U Next Cage Foe

Team Out For Sixth Cage Win

NU cagers, fresh from a decisive victory over Kansas, will entertain Washington University of St. Louis tonight on the Coliseum court.

This is the first of two games on the Husker schedule this week. Coach Good's five will be host to the Iowa State Cyclones Saturday.

The Nebraska five will be looking for its third victory in a row tonight, having won over Harvard and Kansas in their two previous outings.

The Huskers showed vast improvement in the Saturday game, both offensively and defensively. Their adept defensive play is best shown by the fact that Kansas was held to only four field goals in the first half and six in the second, a total of ten. The NU quint also set up a barricade around the boards and held the Jayhawks' rebounding to a minimum.

Retherford's shift to guard proved successful as he turned in a sparkling floor game and racked up 11 points. The Nebraska offensive as a whole was far less erratic than their last appearance here. If the Huskers can play consistent ball of this type on the road, they will be a definite threat in the Big Seven title race.

The Washington team is riding the crest of five straight victories, and should not be regarded too lightly by the Huskers. Little else is definitely known of the Bears, but it is reported that they are a hustling and well-drilled team.

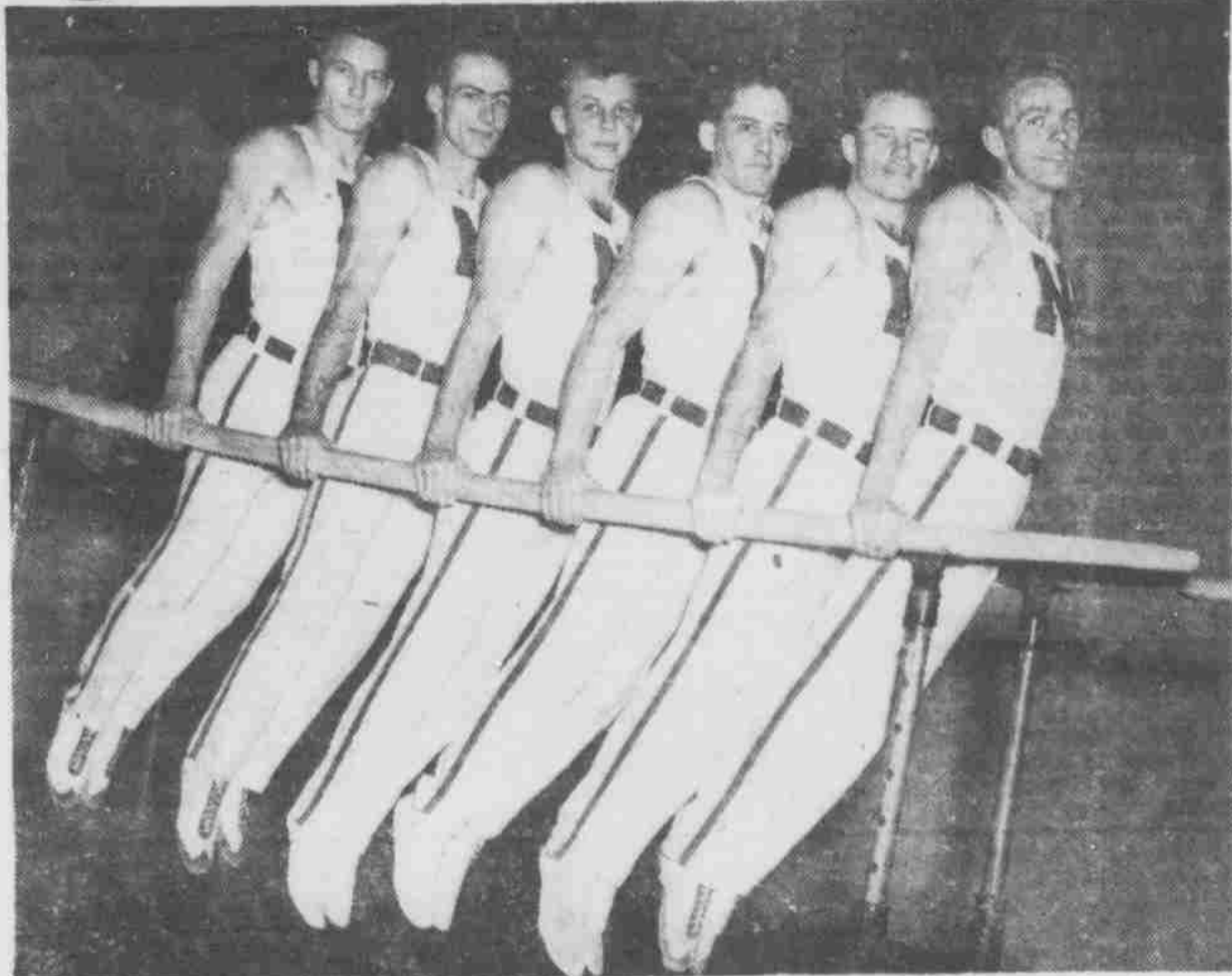
John Palchiff, 5-10 guard, is their key floor man and features an accurate two-hand set shot. Bob Light, who works from the forward spot, is another top scoring threat.
