

# Indoor Track, Field Action Opens Tonight

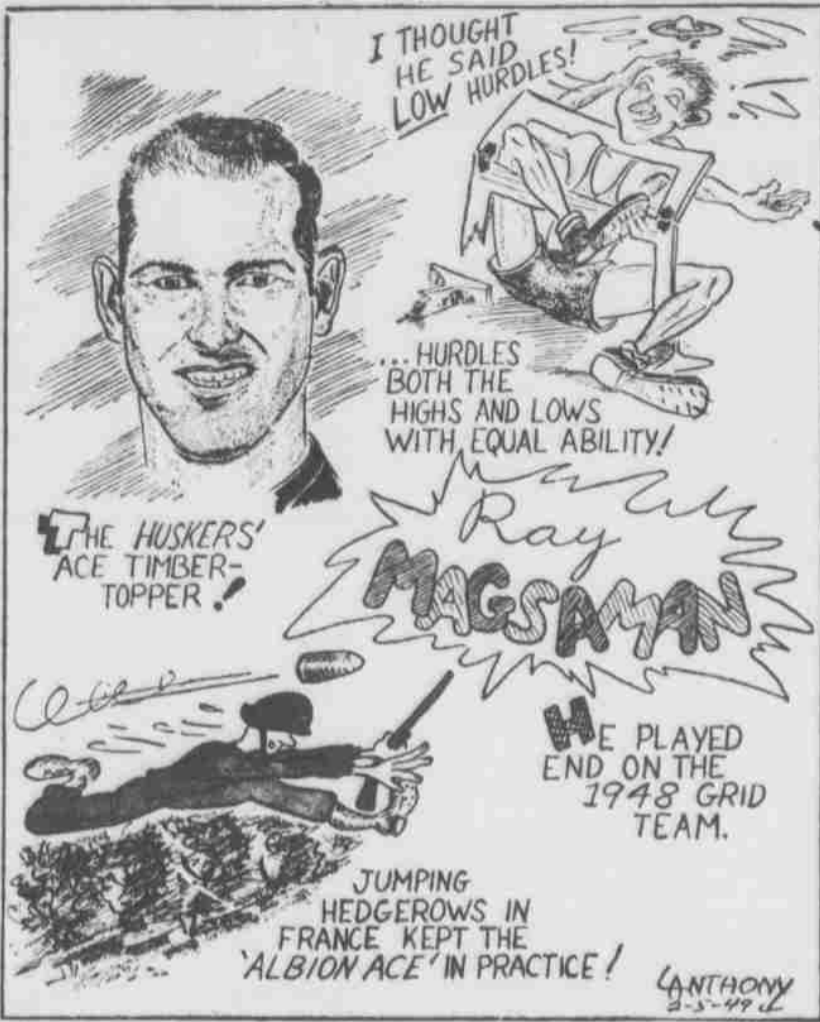

# Road Showing by Husker Five Key to Big 7 Crown

"Can Nebraska win on the road?" An answer to this question, running foremost in the minds of Husker followers, may hold the key to the Big Seven cage crown.

Eight conference games remain on the Cornhusker schedule and six of them will be away from the familiar Coliseum maples. Coach Harry Good's cagers depart this week for a two-game trip to play Kansas and Oklahoma.

The Huskers maintained the loop leadership Saturday night in the 45-43 rock-'em-sock-'em victory over Colorado. However, with a 4-0 record in Big Seven play, Nebraska is a long way from top honors. All four victories have been achieved at home.

Oklahoma, riding along a close second with a 5-1 record, will get its first Big Seven action

in two weeks against the Huskers at Norman on Monday.

**PHOG ALLEN'S** Kansas Jayhawks will be seeking to avenge an early 52-34 loss when they entertain the Huskers at Lawrence Saturday night.

The Jays and Nebraska boast the best over-all records among loop teams with marks of 10-6.

**NEBRASKA'S** remaining home schedule lists Missouri for a Feb. 21 appearance at the Coliseum and Oklahoma in a game which could decide the title on March. The rest of the slate sends the Huskers to all other loop strongholds.

Claude Retherford has been the backbone of the Good-five. As Claude goes, so have the Huskers gone. His play against Colorado was below par, although he provided the winning punch with 17 points. He boasts the best scoring average in the league, a 15.25 per game showing.

Bus Whitehead, closely guarded by Kansas State last Monday and Colorado Saturday night, slipped in the point production but not enough to keep him from the loop's runnerup position.

## Husker Teams In Heavy Slate

Swimming, wrestling, track and basketball teams of the University of Nebraska will be in action this week.

Oklahoma's swimming team will be here Saturday for a 2 p. m. meet. The Sooner wrestling team meets the Nebraska mat team at 7:30 p. m. Saturday.

Ed Weir's track team goes to Columbia Saturday, for a test which should provide a preview of the indoor championships. Missouri has been installed as a favorite to repeat as indoor champions at Kansas City, Feb. 25-26.

Coach Harry Good's basketball team, currently the hottest in the Big Seven, meets Kansas at Lawrence Saturday night, then moves on to Oklahoma for a crucial game against the Sooners Monday.
