Kady Faulkner, associate professor of drawing and painting at the University, will be one of five visiting lecturers in the department of Fine Arts at the University of Colorado in Boulder at their 1949 summer session.

She has taught three summer sessions at Colorado University in 1942-43-47. She obtained a Master of Fine Arts degree from Syracuse University and has attended the Arts Students league, New York City, and the Hans Hoffman Art school.

Others lecturers will include Max Beckmann of Washington University, St. Louis; Charles Lakofsky, Bowling Green State; Maud Ellsworth, University of Kansas and Allen S. Weller, University of Illinois.
