As for individual performances, Darrell Heiss put on one of the most dazzling basketball performances seen in Intramural competition. He continually stole the ball from the bewildered ATO guards to dribble in for lay-ups and consistently made impossible shots. All told, he potted 24 points, 16 in a torrid first half. That was the warning issued Wednesday by the athletic business office. A capacity crowd is expected for the contest, and the business department wants to assure legitimate holders the best seats possible.


Emphasizing that the books are not transferable, and those presented by someone other than their owners can and will be taken up, the department asks that students have their ID cards ready for the checkers at the
