# Journalism Convo Will Feature Progressive Colorado Editor

Houston Waring, known as one of the most progressive editors in the middle West, will be presented by the School of Journalism in a convocation at 5:10 p. m. March 18 in the Love Library auditorium.

Waring, editor of the Littleton, Colo., Independent, was a Nieman fellow at Harvard. He is widely noted for the organization of an editorial advisory board for his paper. The board is composed of leading social scientists

from the University of Colorado and the University of Denver, specialists in many fields. They meet once a month with the editorial staff of the paper. They offer criticisms of the articles pertaining to their fields that have appeared in the Independent during the period since the last meeting. In this way, Waring plans to eliminate inaccuracies in the paper.

Waring has recently returned from delivering the Eric Allen memorial lecture at the University of Oregon. He is here as a guest of the Nebraska Press association.

The purpose of the convocation is to give the Journalism students a chance to hear a successful editor give his views on his specialty.
