NU Research Considered in Budget Request

The University, in requesting a 20 percent increase in its operating budget, has pointed out that this investment has yielded big dividends through the benefits of University research.

Several examples have been given of these benefits derived by the state from University research. A number of years ago University scientists developed a new variety of wheat which has yielded an average annual increase in income from this crop of 12 million dollars.

A control serum for swine erysipelas, developed by a University scientist, has saved Nebraska farmers millions of dollars in hog losses annually.

The University has also conducted research in livestock feeding. Research by University scientists has developed the balanced ration for livestock feeding to add to the yearly production of cattle in Nebraska.
