Husker-OU Nines Clash Today at 3

Jim Sandstedt, veteran hurler, will be the starting pitcher for Coach Tony Sharpe's Cornhusker diamond men Friday as they begin a crucial two game series with league leading Oklahoma. Lefty Gloystein has been nominated to hurl Saturday's game.

Nebraska has a four win, five loss average to 6-2 averages for the Sooners and the Huskers need a clean sweep in the series to keep in the race for the championship.

COACH SHARPE still expresses hope of repeating last year's

late season drive which won them the league pennant. "We were in almost the same position a year ago," Tony states. "If we can stage a late season rush to match the 1948 sprint, we will be in the thick of it."

Fans are anticipating another pitching duel between Jack Shirley, Sooner sophomore sensation, and Bib Jim Sandstedt. Shirley bested Jim in their last meeting at Norman, 2-0, giving up four hits and striking out four. Sandstedt pitched one of his best games as he allowed only seven hits. Oklahoma Coach Jack Baer, however, may decide to use Shirley in the Thursday game against Oklahoma A. & M.

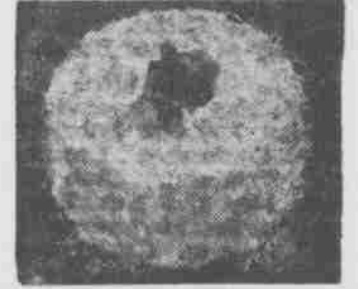

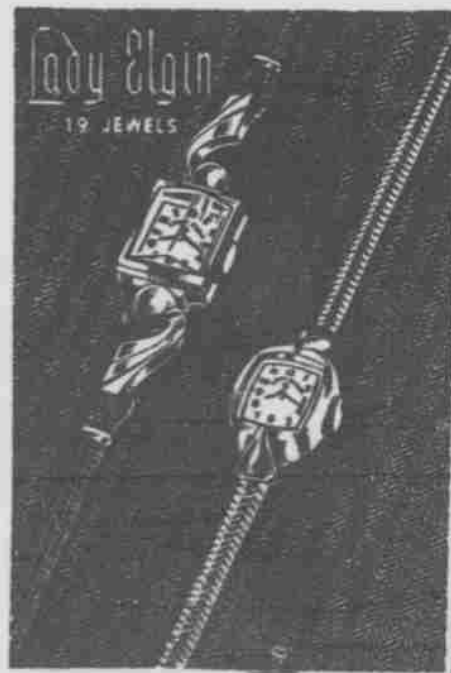

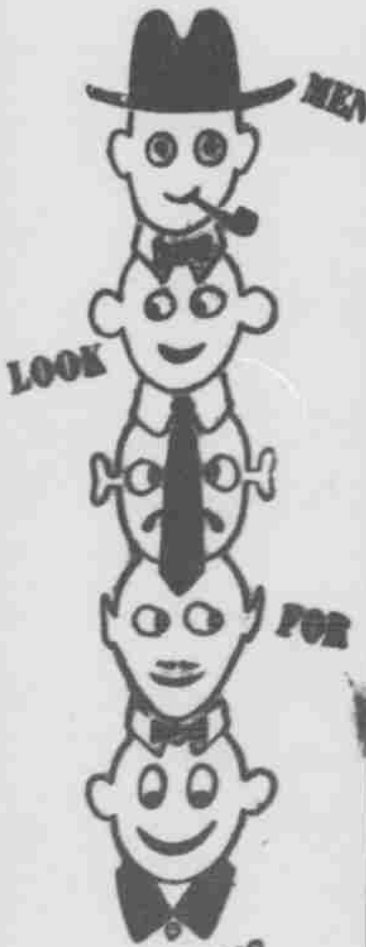
