

# Parking Permits Issued to Over 1,800 NU Students

More than 1800 students have been issued University parking permits for the 1949-50 school year, according to Roz Howard, president of the Student Council. In addition, several hundred faculty permits were issued.

Under the direction of four

Council members a record number of permits have been issued since Sept. 15. The Council office will be open Friday at hours posted in the Union, and from 10-12 noon on Saturday. The University police will not be on duty

Saturday, however, so students should get their permits today.

### Late Parking Permits

For those students who are not able to apply for their parking permits Friday or Saturday, the Student Council will maintain restricted hours next week. The traffic department will also have restricted hours to issue the stickers. The time will be announced later.

Tickets will be given by Campus police next week to student cars which do not have the authorized stickers on the windshields.

### Space Limited

Though permits are issued to all eligible applicants, the number of parking places is limited to 1547. This does not include parking stalls on 10th, 14th, or R streets.

"While parking places on cam-

pus are full, some places less than a block from the campus are not filled most of the time. The stalls east of Bancroft school usually have several empty parking places," according to Roz Howard.

According to Howard, the number of students who have applied for permits who commute from small towns around Lincoln has been surprisingly large.

### Eight Block Radius

In order to insure a fair chance to all students who live far from the campus, an arbitrary limit has been set up for determining eligibility for parking permits. Students living within an eight block radius of the University have necessarily been refused permits.

However, if students feel they have a justified request for parking even though they live in the

restricted area, they may appeal to the traffic committee for a special permit. The committee is composed of several faculty members and Council President Howard.

### Parking Maintenance

The 25c which has been charged for each permit is being put in a fund which will be administered by the Comptrollers office. To be administered at the recommendation of the Traffic Committee, the fund will go for maintenance of the parking lots. This includes cinderling the lots, painting the log limits, and marking street and curb parking limits.

The issuing of permits has been handled by the four members of the Council, Roz Howard, Louise McDill, Phyd Cadwallader, and Fred Chael. In addition, they have been aided by Nebraska Builders, Tassels and Corncobs in keeping the Council office open.

Book sales—3,000 at \$6.00, \$18,000.  
Total, \$33,000.

### Expenses

Printing—3,000 at \$6.45, \$19,350.  
Engraving, \$4,000.  
Photography supplies, \$2,000.  
Photographers salaries, \$700.  
Advertising commissions, \$250.  
Advertising expenses, \$300.  
Individual pictures—panel mounting, \$500.  
Sales commissions, \$450.  
Office expenses, \$150.
