All male Nebraska high school seniors and college students under 21 who wish to apply for the NROTC should submit their applications at once, Capt. W. L. Messmer, professor of naval science at the University, announced.

Application blanks can be obtained from most high school principles or by writing directly to the naval science department at the University, Nov. 12 is the deadline for the applications.

Applicants must be between the ages of 17 and 21 and eligible for entrance into college next fall. The navy will select 2000 men to receive the four-year scholarships, authorized at 52 Universities including Nebraska.

The scholarships will cover the cost of tuition, books, and fees with an additional amount of \$50 a month for living allowances.

Scholarship winners, if quali-fied at graduation, must accept a commission in the regular Navy or Marine Corps for a minimum


