Student Receives Air Force Citation

A University student, Lt. (j.g.) William T. Vierregger, USN, was presented with an Oak Leaf cluster at ceremonies held in the office of Capt. W. L. Messmer, USN, professor of naval science, last Friday.

Lieutenant Vierregger received this air force citation for having

successfully completed over one hundred hazardous missions as a pilot in the Berlin airlift, "Operation Vittles."

The navy officer, an Omahan, was commissioned as a naval aviator in April, 1944, and since that time has had duty assignments in many parts of the world, including the Phillipines, China, Japan and Germany.

Lieutenant Vierregger is attending the university under the Naval officers college training program.
