## Out-Of-State Drivers Told Special Rules

Out-of-state students who drive cars or own a car must comply with some special rules governing licensing according to Captain Casey of the State Safety Patrol. Within thirty days after coming to Nebraska a student is required to procure a Nebraska driver's license. A written examination, eye test and possibly an actual driving test may be taken at the county courthouse in Lincoln. Whether or not the applicant is required to demonstrate his driving ability is left to the discretion of the state patrolman conducting the test.
