# Department Of State Reports NU Project

The University experimental branch of the United Nations will be seen and read throughout the world.

Richard C. Thompson, who is connected with the overseas branch of the state department was sent to Nebraska Oct. 22, to write a story and take pictures of United Nations functions in Nebraska.

Most of the story will be based on the leadership of the University in introducing the teaching of United Nations functions throughout the Nebraska school system. Pictures have been taken of the International Friendship dinner, the model meeting of the United Nations Security Council and the display of world games in Grant Memorial.

Thompson interviewed housewives, storekeepers, policemen, teachers and other individuals representing different occupations in Nebraska. The general question was, "Do you feel that it is for the best interests of Nebraska to have a strong United Nations?"

Thompson stated that this information will be used in film strips, magazine articles, photographs displays and Sunday nature sections to be sent overseas. None of this information will be shown in the United States.

Pictures and copy will go on the "United Nations functions" at the University of Nebraska. From this file, researchers and editors can put together any kind of story they might want.

# Dr. Frank Glick Reviews Social Security Problem

The time has arrived when American citizens ought to stop "fuzzy thinking" and begin searching their minds and consciences for the faults and virtues of government social security programs.

This was the advice given Thursday morning by Dr. Frank Glick, head of the University Graduate School of Social Work, in an address to the ninth annual Nebraska Social Work institute.

"Many citizens believe that social security . . . is a bad thing," Dr. Glick said. "The final conclusion is that people are on social security because they would rather not provide for themselves."

Glick said that the idea that public assistance created dependency in old age is an old and tenacious idea which sounds plausible except that there are several important ways

in which it fails to fit the fact. First, he said, human beings are not inherently lazy. A second fact is that public relief is given in conservative amounts, he added. A third fact, he said, is that most people find public assistance a distasteful necessity.

"I believe that neither our present social security program nor the extensions of it which lie ahead of us are any cause for shedding tears," Glick said. "You must face the difficult problems which it poses in public policy and administration."

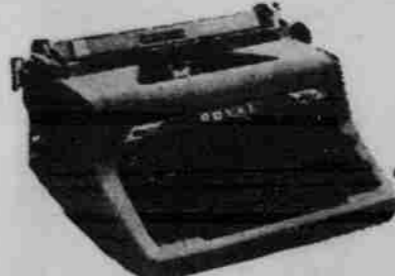
