Sigma Alpha Epsilon is the 1952 All-University intramural basketball champion. The Sig Alphas walked through the grueling play-offs to the coveted title and advanced from sixth place before the tourney to the top spot.

Only two losses mar the 17-game slate for the champions. The SAE cagers bowed to runner-up Sigma Phi Epsilon at the beginning of the season and to Delta Tau Delta (No. 8) in their last regular-season contest. They own victories over the Sig Eps (twice), the Deltas (twice), M-Street (No. 3) and Phi Kappa Psi (No. 4).

Sigma Phi Epsilon reached the fraternity "A" finals before falling before the Sig Alphas are get the number two position in the university. The Sig Eps defeated Sigma Alpha Epsilon (No. 1), Alpha Tau Omega (No. 6), Delta Tau (No. 8) twice, and Sigma Nu (No. 9). They lost to the Sig Alphas twice and to Phi Delta Theta (unrated).

Phi Kappa Psi finished the season in fourth place after riding atop the heap for three weeks. They defeated Alpha Tau Omega (No. 6), and Sigma Nu (No. 9) twice. They lost to the Sig Alphas and the ATO's.

Denominational champion Newman Club winds up the season in fifth place. Their only loss during the season was to M-Street.

Alpha Tau Omega is the number six team. The Taus dropped the Phi Psi's (No. 4) and Sigma Nu (No. 9) twice while losing to the Phi Psi's and second place Sigma Phi Epsilon.

The Dental College Freshmen get the nod at seventh place. They lost to M-Street (No. 3) twice and to Delta Sigma Pi (unrated).

**Delta Tau Delta slips in on the eighth rung with an 11-4 record. They defeated Sigma Alpha Epsilon (No. 1) while losing to the Sig Alphas twice and to Sigma Phi Epsilon (No. 2) twice.**

The ninth place team is Sigma Nu which broke even in 14 games. They lost to the Sig Eps, the Phi Psi's (No. 4) twice, and ATO's (No. 6) twice, and to Alpha

Another independent team gets the nod at tenth place. Shorties round out the clamored circle with an 11-5 record. They lost to M-Street (No. 3) and twice to both the Dorm A Comets and Navy ROTC (both unrated).

Sigma Chi and Phi Gamma Deltas are the number one and two outfits in fraternity "B" basketball. The Sigs won it all in the finals by dropping a good fight team, 36-33. They won 13 of 14 contests during the season, their only loss coming at the hands of the same Phi Gams. They avenged the loss, however, with two victories over the Eps.

In addition, they dropped Sigma Alpha Epsilon (No. 4) three times, dropped Alpha Tau Omega (No. 6) and own two victories over Phi Delta Theta (No. 8).

The Phi Gams defeated Alpha Gamma Rho (No. 3), Sigma Alpha Epsilon (No. 4) twice, and Phi Delta Theta (No. 8) twice. Their only two losses came at the hands of the top Sig outfit.

Alpha Gamma Rho finishes the season in third place. The Aggies own victories over Alpha Tau Omega (No. 6) and Phi Kappa Psi (No. 7) twice. Their losses came at the hands of Phi Gamma Delta (No. 2) and Alpha Tau Omega (No. 6).

Bob Diers, leading sticker in 1951, with a mark of .383 in 15 games, is firmly planted in centerfield. Milt Frei of Fremont has been getting the call in right and Jerry Dunn, a senior, has been patrolling left field.

Ray Novak may double in brass as a first sacker and pitcher. Bob Reynolds, temporarily hobbled by a sprained ankle suffered in basketball, is figured for duty again at second base.

Ray Mladovich, Omaha, who has been playing first base the past two seasons, is back home again at shortstop. Ray was a shortstop during his high school career when he started in American Legion junior baseball.

Bob Decker, defensive halfback in football, has been getting the nod at third base. Richard Christoph of Glencoe, Ill., has been making a serious bid for an outfield post, Coach Sharpe stated.

The present team is being built around seven lettermen, Dale Bunsen, Robert Diers, Gerald Dunn, Richard McCormick, Ray Mladovich, Robert Reynolds and Jack Shull.

Shull, a catcher, will have to fight off a group of the best backstops the Cornhuskers have ever had at one time.

Jim Cederdahl, Lincoln, Murray Backhaus, Millard, and Gerald Sandbulte, Sioux Center, Ia., are

all pushing the veterans Shull.

Since Coach Sharpe took over the Cornhuskers, his teams have won two Big Seven titles in 1948 and again in 1950. In the conference race the five-year totals show 43 won, 27 lost for a .614 percentage. In all games played, the Cornhusker have won 58 and lost 42 for a mark of .580 in this five-year span.
