Members of the senior class of the University of Kansas will give their alma mater this spring two flagpoles, a stone wall and landscaping near the entrance of the fieldhouse. Plans have also been made for a senior day picnic to be held off the campus this year for the first time.

A minimum of five faculty judges will select the best actresses and actor from participation in University theater productions. At the end of the season, each judge ranks the actors and actresses in each group. The first ranking actor and actress in each group receives an oscar.

The best actors and actresses in major and supporting roles in experimental theater will receive gold cups. Winners are chosen on the basis of characterization. A silver key will be presented to the outstanding man or woman in technical phases of University theater.

Spotlights will flash on the new members of Masquers, University honorary dramatic society. Students are chosen on personal and social qualities and work and interest in all the phases of theater.

From the membership of Nebraska Masquers, the man and woman who perform the most outstanding service in theater activities will receive a plaque and gold key. These persons are chosen by the University theater staff.

Masquers seniors will honor an outstanding freshman working in theater activities each year. The seniors decide what the award will be.

A gold cup will be presented to the man or woman with the most success in play directing. The winning director is chosen by the University theater staff.

The best actress and actor in laboratory theater will receive gold cups. A committee of judges choose winners irrespective of the size of role.

A man or woman achieving the most outstanding success in scene design for a production will be presented a silver key. University theater staff chooses the winning production designer.

The dinner, at which awards will be made, is at 6:30 p.m. at the Lincoln hotel. Tickets for the eighth annual dinner are \$2 and may be purchased from any Masquer member. Tickets sales end Wednesday.
