

### Grad Record Examinations Set Jan. 30-31

Graduate record examinations are scheduled for Jan. 30 and 31, 1953, said Harold E. Wise, assistant dean of graduate college.

Scores on these examinations constitute a desirable credential to submit when applying for admission to the Graduate College of the University or for a graduate fellowship or assistantship, Wise said.

Information as to the specific requirements of the various departments of the University may be secured from the department chairmen. A number of other graduate schools require that scores on the graduate record examination be presented in support of application for admission or for a fellowship or assistantship.

Application forms for those who wish to take the examinations may be secured in the office of Professor H. M. Cox, Director of the Bureau of Instructional Research, Temporary A.

Joined in such a manner as to permit free flow of traffic on all levels. Proposed construction will be designed to conform to costs of approximately \$500,000 at present cost averages.

The addition will consist of basement level and two floors above in a modified "L" shape. A center court or patio will open off the fountain room and main lounge and will house bowling lanes at basement level.

Other recreation facilities considered are a billiard room to accommodate eight tables, a table tennis room with a minimum of eight tables, and table games facilities for card games, duo-units for chess and checkers.

A proposal is being considered for a snack bar and fountain lounge with adjoining outdoor terrace.

Cultural facilities proposed include a recital and reception room, a wall arrangement designed for art displays, a television lounge seating approximately 75, and built-in display cases along corridors for exhibiting art objects, handicrafts, and departmental works.

Student organization offices and file room are proposed, arranged as units or three or four small offices with conference room adjoining each unit. About eight to 12 office areas are proposed.

Offices and service areas for Union Activities will be located near north entrance with corridor service counter, suite of offices and meeting area, and a private office for Activities Director.
