Cross, president of OU, calmed the situation Friday when he reported Kraft's trip to Dallas as an exploratory mission for the Oklahoma board of resents.

With all of the conference basketball squads busily playing non-conference foes until the Big Seven Tournament at Kansas City, the Kansas State Wildcats loom as the team to beat. The Cats edged a powerful Indiana team, 82-80, Saturday night, as big center Dick Knostman threw in 27 points for K-State. Indiana was pre-season favorite for second place in the Big Ten this season.

In other headline loop play last week end, Oklahoma (2-1) stopped a last-minute rally by Southern Methodist to win, 59-54, at home. Missouri opened its season with a 66-62 win over Ft. Leonard Wood, a highly-regarded Army outfit, Sophomore forward Win Wilfong led Sparky Stalcup's Tigers with 15 points.

Rice Institute handed Kansas, last year's National intercollegiate championship five, a 54-51 upset for KU's first loss of the season. The Jays have lost all but a little of the mighty strength which they proudly presented last year. They will be Nebraska's first foe in the Big Seven tourney.


