World-Herald Says May Queen 16 Lives Saved

The Omaha World-Herald sponsored Crusade for Safety has now accumulated 11,500 signed and returned safety pledges from the Nebraska-Iowa area.
 The Crusade, which has been in progress since Jan. 1, has accounted for 16 "saved" lives, according to the World-Herald. Nine of these "saved" are Nebraskans, while the other seven are from the vicinity of southwest Iowa.
 Last year, total highway deaths as of March 7, stood at 36; this year only 27 Nebraskans have perished in auto accidents.
 The Daily Nebraskan has endorsed and is participating with the World-Herald in this campaign to bring safety to the highways, in view of the recent auto accidents which claimed the life of one University student and sent two others to the hospital with serious injuries.
 To date, over 50,000 safety pledges have been circulated by clubs, groups and co-operating newspapers. For the past week

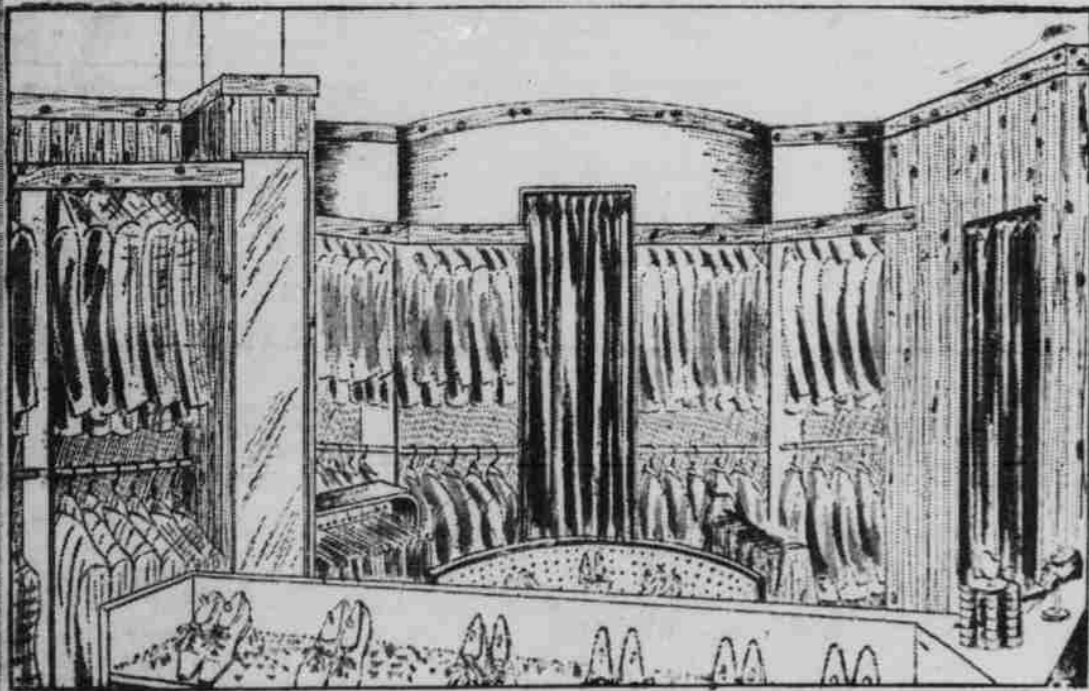

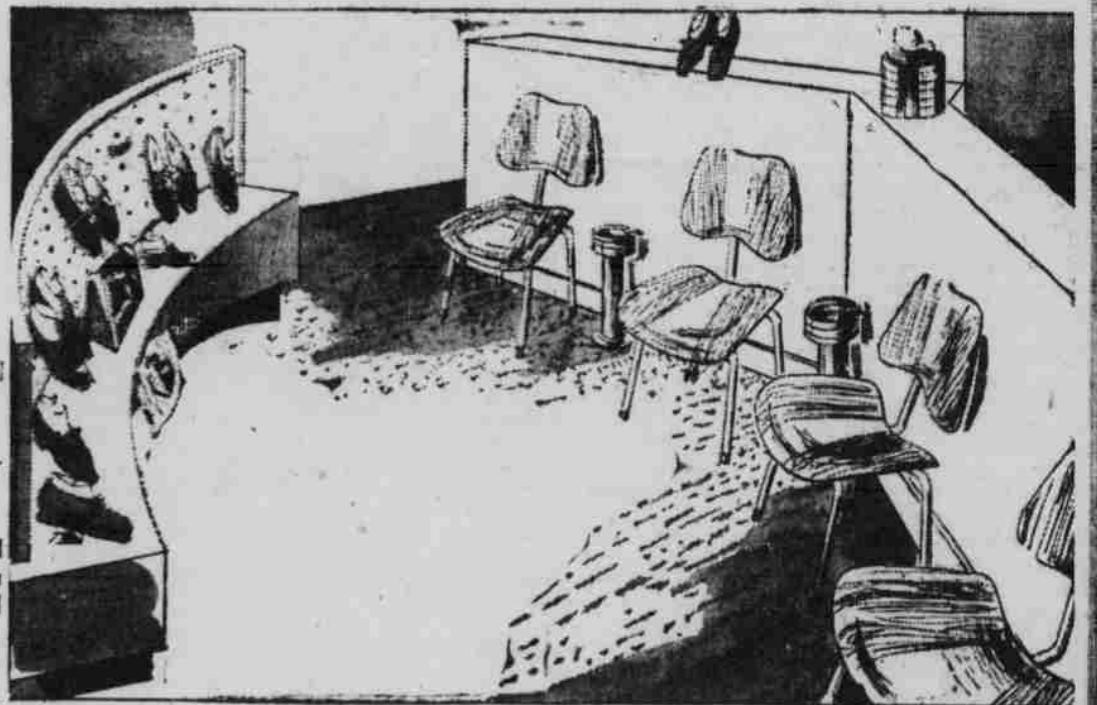
