ROTC Summer Camps Draw 370 NU Students

Boys Express Varied Reactions To Rigorous Training Schedules

Approximately 370 University ROTC students attended Army, Navy and Air Force sessions this summer. Army ROTC enrolled 157 trainees in seven different camps, divided as follows: 34 men in the Infantry Division at Ft. Benning, Ga.; 20 men in the Engineer Corps at Camp Carson, Colo.; 33 men with the Ordnance Corps at Aberdeen; Proving Grounds in Maryland; 34 men in the Military Police company at Camp Gordon, Ga.; 29 men in Artillery training at Ft. Sill, Okla.; five men with the Medical Service at Ft. Sam Houston, Texas; and one man with the Quartermaster Company at Ft. Lee, Va.

AIR FORCE ROTC trained 110 men at six camps: 12 men at Sheppard AFB, Texas; 26 men at Webb AFB, Tex.; 19 men at Randolph AFB, Texas; 24 men at Gary AFB, San Marcos, Tex.; 10 men at Mather AFB, Calif.; and 19 men at Hamilton AFB, Calif.

Navy ROTC sent 102 trainees to four centers. Eleven contract senior midshipmen went on a six-week Caribbean cruise, 51 sophomore and senior midshipmen

went to South America on an eight weeks cruise and 28 men received aviation-amphibian training, including three weeks at Corpus Christi, Tex., and three weeks at Little Creek, Va. Opinions of trainees who attended the summer camps differed somewhat but most agreed about the rigorous training schedule and value of knowledge received.

FRED SMIDT, trainee at Hamilton AFB said, "It was a very good experience. You actually don't know anything about the Air Force or the way the service operates until you go to summer camp."

Rex Meyer, Army ROTC cadet who received artillery training at Ft. Sill, Okla., was especially interested in the firing of the 280mm. atomic cannon. However, he reported the training "rough" and the weather hot.

Ed Schmidt, NROTC junior who took aviation training at Corpus Christi, Tex., and amphibian work at Virginia thoroughly enjoyed the trip. He said, "It was very interesting. I was especially interested in the amphibian section, but the entire trip was very informative."
