The availability of starting center Bob Oberlin for the KU fray loomed as a big question mark. Glassford commented that the big pivot has not recovered from his ankle injury as rapidly as was hoped.

"THE BOYS seem to be in good spirits," the NU mentor said, "and ought to be rested."

The varsity squad ran against freshmen earlier this week, with the NU frosh displaying KU play patterns.

The Jayhawks will arrive in Lincoln Friday night by train.
