

# O'Connor's Hawks Aim For Cornhuskers

## Iowa Coach Expects Improved Performances From Soph Stars

More experimenting with various lineup combination has been the plan for University of Iowa basketball players this week, Coach Bucky O'Connor said, as the second step in the development of the Hawkeyes through December non-conference games.

The Iowans won their opener from a veteran Washington University team last Saturday, 51-49, and next face the Huskers here Saturday night. Next home opponent is Colorado A&M Dec. 15.

"I WAS pleased with our defensive play but on offense our players must get better if a 3-1 break and should take many more shots. Actually they should have around 80 shots and they took only 47," Coach O'Connor commented.

He said that his plan of using two complete teams in units was

successful in that it put more players into the game, one of the objectives of the experiments. However, O'Connor may not necessarily continue this method, depending upon how various players react to different groups.

"I expected some of our sophomores to be tense in their opener but that will be overcome with more experience. But we must improve on our outside shooting to loosen up defenses," the coach declared.

On the starting team were only two veterans, Deacon Davis, forward; and Chuck Jarnagin, guard. The all-sophomore combination played about 23 minutes, including all of the second half, broken up by two late guard replacements, Logan with 11 points was Iowa's higher scorer, followed by Sharm Scheuerman

and Roy Johnson, each with 8, and Davis with 6.

Iowa's shot percentage for the opener was only 277 but the players hit 757 on free throws.
