Bradley First Foe For Nebraska Five

Coach Jerry Bush's University of Nebraska cagers will travel this week end to Peoria, Ill., to play Bradley University Saturday night.

Bradley will be the first in a three-game tour. The Huskers will meet Alabama at Tuscaloosa Monday and Memphis State at Memphis Wednesday.

Bill Wells, regular guard who missed the South Dakota game, will be ready for action. Wells was out due to an infected foot. Stan Matzke, 6-2 starting guard, also missed the So. Dak. game with an injured elbow. It is not known if Matzke will be ready for the trip.

In 1952, Nebraska beat Bradley 73-65.

Coach Bush watched Alabama beat Bradley 84-65 earlier this year. Bradley reportedly has been improving with each game, how-

ever, and will be rough. Nebraska and Bradley will be about equal in height.

Alabama has a fine team, according to Bush, and will hold a definite height advantage. The same is true for Memphis State. "We have a good chance," Bush stated recently. "I've never taken a losing attitude yet," he added.

The Huskers will leave for Peoria Friday via train. Sunday they will travel to St. Louis and then to Tuscaloosa by plane. The remainder of the trip will be completed by plane.

Basketball Forward Chuck Smith leads Cornhusker scoring with 33 points for two games. Smith, a junior, has connected for 19 free tosses in 22 attempts.

Sophomore Forward Rex Ekwall, 6-4, is close behind with 30 points. In addition, Ekwall leads the Huskers in the rebound column with 27.

Coach Rollie Lepley's swimmers tied Grinnell College of Iowa 42-42 in a meet held at Grinnell. It was the first meet for the Cornhuskers. The gymnastics squad coached by Jake Geier will open its season here Jan. 14 in a triangular meet with Minnesota and Kansas State.

Comstock Promoted

Huskers Work Hard Preparing For New Years Day Encounter

As the Nebraska football team goes into serious practice for their New Year's engagement with Duke, two men were dropped from the squad and another was moved to the first unit. Still two other men were also advanced.

Don Comstock, who played a stellar role with the second unit all year and improved with every game, was promoted to the first unit, shifting Ron Clark to right halfback and moving Willie Greenlaw to the second unit. Jon McWilliams, who was shifted from halfback to end in the middle of the season, may see action with the No. 1 unit. Bob Berguin, No. 2 center, is being shifted to guard.

Korinek Ready

Dennis Korinek, who was forced out of the Hawaii trip because of a broken jaw, was put back on the No. 2 eleven. He will be ready to go full speed by the Duke clash. Two reserves, Dirkes Ralston and fullback Jim Yeisley, were dropped from the team because of violation of University rules. Ralston was team captain in the Hawaii tilt.

The first two units will line up like this in practice: No. 1—Dan Brown at quarterback, Comstock and Clark at halfbacks, and Bob

Smith at fullback. Andy Loehr and McWilliams at ends, Bill Holleran and Don Glantz at tackles, Charlie Bryant and Berguin or Bob Wagner at guards, and Bob Oberlin at center.

No. 2—Don Erway at quarterback, Greenlaw and Korinek at halfbacks, and John Edwards at fullback. Bill Giles and Don Hewitt at ends, Pev Evans and Jerry Peterson at tackles, Bill Taylor and Jim Murphy, at guards, and La Verne Torczon at center.

Coach Bill Glassford said that rough work would continue through the 26th of the month. They plan on working out at Memorial Stadium before going to the fieldhouse for fundamental drills. 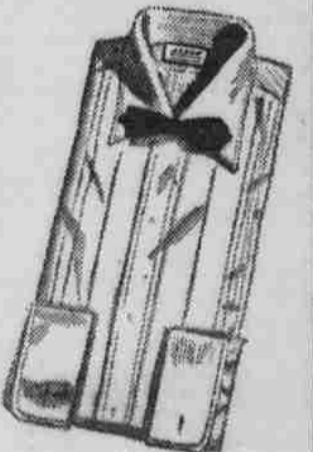
