Chorus To Present 'The Mighty Casey'

America's No. 1 pastime, baseball, and music will be combined in the presentation of the opera, "The Mighty Casey," by the University Summer Chorus Friday at 8 p.m. in the Howell Memorial Theatre.

The public is invited and admission will be by tickets only which may be obtained free of charge from the Music Department, Union or Howell Theatre.

Leads in the baseball game within the opera will be played by Vaughn Jaenike as Casey, John Schwartz as the narrator and Carol Je. Armstrong as Casey's girl friend.

An opera is given yearly by the chorus as part of an opera workshop sponsored by the School of Fine Arts and the University Summer Sessions. Most of the enrollees are Nebraska music teachers working toward graduate degrees.

Earl Jenkins, assistant professor of voice who is the music director, said "The Mighty Casey" by William Schuman "was created under

the influence of the rising trend of American opera, rooted in our own culture and traditions. This trend is nearly becoming more dominant and, it is believed by many, represents the best hope for a vital American theater of musical drama".

The original verses of Ernest Thayer's "Casey at the Bat" appear intact in the opera's libretto.

Stage director is Clarence Denton, instructor in the Department of Speech and Dramatic Art. Shirley Hertz is accompanist, Dorothy Maxwell, choreographer; Jim Tomasek, lighting technician, and Dale Ganz, assistant lighting technician.

1st Lt. Dorcas A. Starns of the Women's Army Corps will visit the University Thursday and Friday to interest University seniors and graduate students in becoming officers.

"There is a great need for Women Officers in our National Defense Program which can best be filled by young college graduates," said Lt. Starns. "We are particularly interested in contacting qualified young women who are considering fields in which they may receive additional education as well as an interesting career."

Lt. Starns, who is assigned to Fifth Army Headquarters in Chicago, will be at Ellen Smith Hall from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. both days.

Women with college degrees, who are accepted, enter the Army as First or Second Lieutenants, depending on their qualifications, and serve for a two-year period or more.


