

Andros, Jennings Selected By Elliott As Assistants

Dee Gus Andros, another All-Big Seven Oklahoman, has been named to the coaching staff by Director of Athletics Bill Orwig and Football Coach Pete Elliott, as line coach.

Andros, presently an assistant at Texas Tech, will be on a year-to-year basis at a salary of \$7,200. This will give him the rank of assistant professor.

A native of Oklahoma City, Andros played at Oklahoma City Central High School and four years at the University of Oklahoma. He was an All Big Seven choice in the line as a senior. He competed as a freshman and participated in three bowl games.

After receiving a B.Sc. degree from Oklahoma in 1950, Andros remained as freshman coach that fall. He moved up to the varsity squad in 1951, serving two years as assistant coach and receiving a master's degree in education in 1952.

In 1953 he moved to Kansas as offensive line coach under Jules Sikes.

Andros is a Mason and a member of the Methodist Church. While in school he was vice president of Phi Delta Kappa, an educational honorary, and a member of Acacia social fraternity.

He was a sergeant in the Marine Corps, serving at Iwo Jima, Hawaii and Japan in the Pacific Theater. He won a Bronze Star for action at Iwo Jima.

The line coach is married. He is expected in Lincoln around Feb. 1. On Wednesday, Bill Jennings was named as backfield by Orwig and Elliott.

Jennings served as backfield

coach at the University of Oklahoma for seven years. He will also be paid on a year-to-year basis. His salary has been announced as being \$8000 and will hold the position of assistant professor.

Jennings resigned after the 1953 season at Oklahoma to become associated with an oil company in Fort Worth, Tex.

He played end at Norman High School where his coach was Dewey "Snorter" Lurter, who later became head coach at Oklahoma from 1941 to 1945 and is presently

boxing coach at the Sooner institution. At Oklahoma Jennings played wingback and end in 1938-'39-'40. He is a native of Norman and holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from Oklahoma.

Jennings developed several All American backs while at Oklahoma. Among them are Eddie Crowder, quarterback; Buck Mc-

Phail, fullback; and Billy Vessels, halfback.

Playing in the 1940 East-West game, Jennings fielded all four tosses thrown to him by Paul Christian, all-time Missouri great. He established four pass catching records at Oklahoma which still stand. They are most passes received in one season—26 in 1940, most yards received passes one season—292 in 1940, most passes received during career—70 and most yards received passes during career—753.

Jennings coached one year at Cushing, Okla. High School after graduation. He then enlisted in the Marine Corps, serving from June 1942 until 1946 when he joined the Oklahoma coaching staff. Bill is a member of the Marine Corps Reserve and holds the rank of captain.

Cornhuskers Go After Second Conference Win Against Buffs

Revenge will once again be the motive as the Nebraska Cornhuskers play host to the Colorado Buffaloes tomorrow night at the Coliseum. Tip-off time is scheduled for 7 p.m.

As was the case in the Missouri-Nebraska tilt last Monday, the Huskers will be out to seek revenge for an earlier loss to the

Buffs. They bowed to CU in the conference opener for both fives 78-63 at Boulder.

The visitors bring an undefeated league standard to Lincoln and an overall 6-5 mark. Besides their win over NU, they downed the Missouri Tigers at Boulder last Saturday 79-72. They had bowed to the Tigers previously at the Big 7 pre-season tournament at Kansas City 82-79.

The Buffs opened their season in winning fashion dropping the Oregon State quintet 65-53 and the Oregon Beavers 68-49. They then pulled an upset in downing the Iowa Hawkeyes 60-57.

They then lost their next three, bowing to Brigham Young twice and Colorado A&M. They beat Oklahoma in the first round of the tourney, but then bowed to Iowa State and MU.

For the invading Buffs, they will start with Mel Coffman and Jim Ranglos at forwards, George Hannah at center, and Bill Peterson and Dave Mowbray at guards.

Ranglos at 6-4 and Hannah at 6-7 are currently pacing the Buff scoring barrage. Ranglos is averaging 15.6 points a contest and Hannah is running second with a 11.5 mark.

Ranglos led the Buffs in their opener with NU by garnering 22 points, 12 of them from the gift stripe. Hannah had his best night of the season with a 28 point outburst against the Oklahoma Sooners.

Coach Jerry Bush will go with the combination that opened up in the 83-77 win over the Bengals. He will start with Rex Ekwall and Chuck Smith at forwards, Don Smidt a center, and Norm Coufal and Duane "Whitey" Buel at guards.

Buel broke into the starting five last Monday after missing the first 11 Huskers games with a broken collarbone. He played a good floor-game against MU and hit five points.
