The rules which will govern the mock political Convention were released by the rules committee call and the amount of the votes, except as herein otherwise provided.

**Rules Announced** 

These rules will determine the procedure and techniques of the convertion, James Harrison, faculty adviser, said.

No nominations shall be made by acclamation. Nomination of a candidate for the Presidency and the Vice-Presidency shall require a roll-call of the states, the nominee beling the first person to receive to of the total votes cast.

XV Each state shall be entitled to a number of votes equal to that state's electoral vote. The territories and districts shall be entitled to the number of votes assigned to them by the Executive Committee,

Hereinafter, the term "state" shall refer to either states or tetritories, as represented at this Convention. XVII Any state may change its vote by an-

nouncins publicit, between the conclusion of a roll call and the announcement of the votes of that roll call, the corrected vote. The Chair shall allow at least one minute before announcing the results of any roll call for states to do so Each delegation shall present to the Sec-XVIII

Each delegation shall present to the Secretary of the Convention, no later than the Saturdas before the Convention, a list of the accredited delegates and alternates. The names shall be typed, arranged in a column. The delegates may be assigned a full vote, a half vote, or quarter vote, and the strength of each delegate's vote shall be indicated on the credentials list. Alternates shall be indicated on the list as assigned to a specific delegate, or as alternates-at-large. If any delegate is absent, his assigned alternate shall cast his vote. If he has no assigned alternate, the first alternate-at-large shall cast bis vote. The Chair shall entertain, at its discretion, motions for a recess, at any time dur-ing the proceedings, for whatever length of time the Chair shall suggest, or the motion shall indicate, Provided that this rule shall not supersede Rule 14. XIX

Any ruling of the Chair may be over-turned, by appeal from the flow, and by \$\frac{5}{2}\$ vote of the convention.

If there are fewer delegates and alternates combined present than the number of votes assigned to the state, the chairman of the delegation may, at his discretion, cast the votes of the absent delegate. PRO-VIDED, That 5 of the proper number of delegates or alternates must be present for the absent vote to be cast.

These rules or any of them, shall be amended suspended, or added to, by a vote of \$\frac{1}{2}\$ of the delegates voting. Such a motion shall be in order at any time, except during a roll call, or between the end of a roll call and the announcement of the results of that roll call.

# The list of delegates shall indicate whether any delegation has adopted the "unit rule." If such indication is in the affirmative, the Chair shall enforce the unit rule as follows; Whenever any unit rule state is called, the chairman of that delegation shall announce the state's vote. If the numbers of that delegation challenge the accuracy of the chairman's announcement, the Chair shall cause the delegation to be privately polled from the official credentials list. If the majority of the delegates present shall cast their votes for a single candidate, then entire vote of that delegation shall be so cast. 


