# Husker Crew Treks To OU

The Nebraska baseball team will try once again to get back into action today and tomorrow as they invade Norman, Oklahoma and take on the Sooners.

The Huskers currently are leading the Big Seven conference with a 2-0 record following the Colorado victory over Missouri Tuesday. The Tigers now have a 4-1 record.

This will mark the first action in two weeks for the Huskers who will put their three-game winning streak on the line against the Sooners.

Rain washed out scheduled home contests against Offutt Air Base and Kansas University. The two conference games with KU have been cancelled and the Offutt game has been re-scheduled for the Nebraska diamond at 3:00 Monday.

Coach Tony Sharpe has nominated lefty Roger Bottorff to face the Sooners in the Friday opener. Bottorff in ten innings this spring has been very effective giving up only one earned run for a 0.90 earned-run average. Last year the Lincoln junior had a sparkling 0.53 ERA in 17 innings.

Coach Sharpe's starting nine includes four sophomores, three juniors and only two seniors. Probable Husker batting order includes: Al Karle, second base; Gary Reimers, centerfield; Dan Brown, third base; Don Erway, catcher; Norm Coufal, shortstop; Gene Torson, leftfield; Larry Lewis, rightfield; John Beideck, first base and Bottorff.

Either Charley Zeigenbein or Willie Greenlaw will hurl the Saturday contest for Nebraska. They are both left handers.

Tony Risinger, another right-

hander will hurl this one for Coach Jack Bear's crew. Risinger was one of the nations top sophomore hurlers last season.

The tennis team, who bowed to Iowa State on All-Sports Day, will be meeting the Wildcats for the first time this year. The racquet crew has a record of 3-7.

The baseball team, who was cheated out of a two-game series with the Kansas Jayhawks because of bad weather, moves into Oklahoma for two, Friday and Saturday.
