Winners of team trophies in the spring day competition were Teachers College in the faculty division, Love Hall in the women's division and Phi Delta Theta in the men's division.

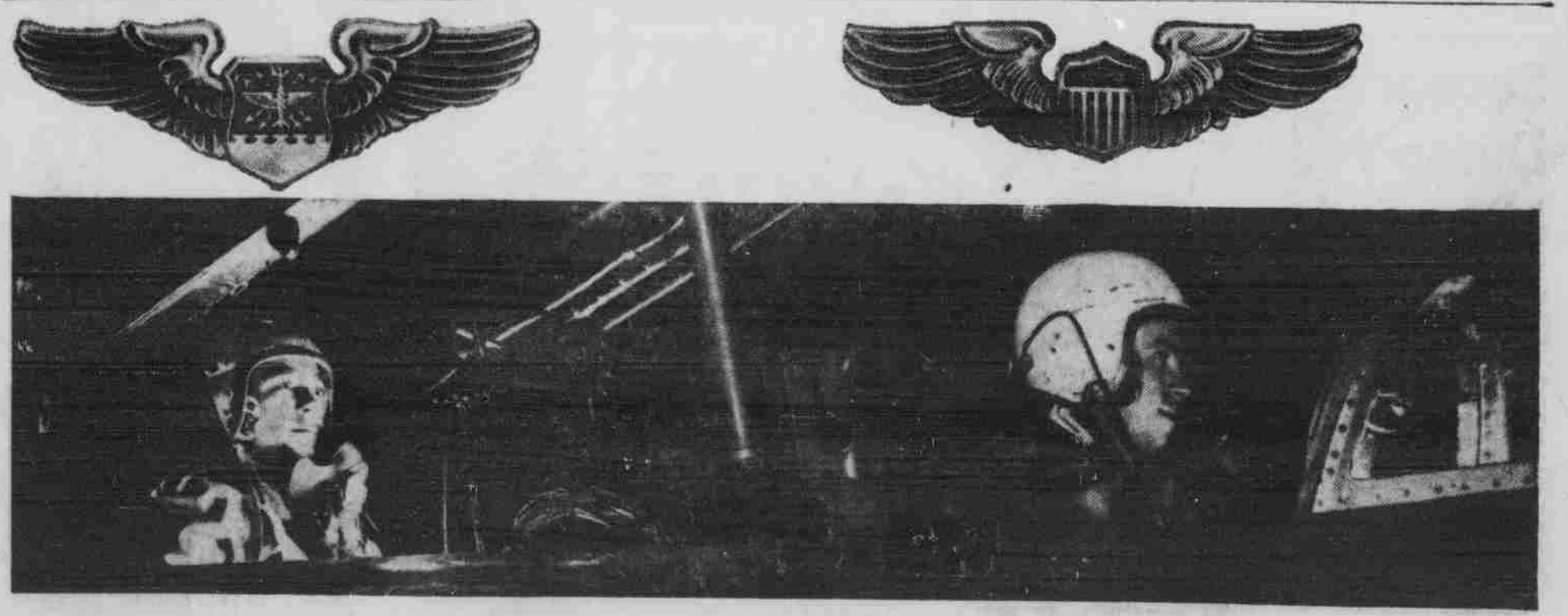
Runner-up in the faculty section was Ag College followed by Business Administration and the College of Arts and Science.
