

The Rev. Cross:

Episcopalian Chaplain Resigns From Position

The Rev. William Cross recently resigned as chaplain of the University Episcopal Chapel in order to accept a position as rector of the parish of the Church of the Holy Trinity in Lincoln.

During the four years that the Rev. Mr. Cross has served as chaplain, the entire program and policy of student work and participation in chapel activities have been revised and broadened.

"The program of the University Chapel is now entirely directed to students and organized to meet their needs," the Rev. Mr. Cross said.

All officers and members of the chapel staff are students, including the organist, choir members and janitor, he said.

Since the Rev. Mr. Cross has been chaplain, Diocesan support and control of the work of the chapel have been substantially increased, and a permanent residence for the chaplain has been secured.

"The program of the University Chapel has recently been put under the supervision of a board of advisors of faculty and interested laymen," the Rev. Mr. Cross said. Plans for the reconstruction and expansion of the chapel and student center are also now in the formative stage.

During his four years in the Diocese, the Rev. Mr. Cross has served on various diocesan boards, including the College Division of the Department of Christian Education and the Division of Stewardship and Missionary Information of the Department of Promotion.

He also was a member of the Board of Examining Chaplains and the Executive Council of the Dio-
